Lightening does strike twice

I was recently asked to attend a customer's home to check their computer for infected files following yet another scam. I say that as it was the second such scam this customer had endured and the second such scam experienced by two other customers in this area in the past 4 weeks.

These are local people and professional scammers had targeted them, they seemed to have information of very large sums of money and knew them by name, had knowledge of their bank details and approximate amounts held in their respective bank accounts (knowing their bank details maybe wasn't just a lucky guess)!

The scam follows the same pattern as several other people have experienced. The scammers say a bank account is under threat and money should be moved quickly. One customer was asked to login to an online app and up load an image of themselves, this was used by the scammers to authenticate the transfer of money.

The sad thing is their details are now on a SUCKERS List and will be sold on the dark web.

Please, if you receive a phone call referring to your bank account, put the phone down and telephone your bank for confirmation.

DO NOT USE THE PHONE NUMBER GIVEN IN THE CALL!

Users of Windows 7 have found their systems are malfunctioning as Microsoft has switched off all support for the old OS. People using Windows Live Mail 2012 should rethink how they access emails. Why? 3 customers have recently lost all access to their email accounts through this software along with all their emails and contacts.



On another costly note, Microsoft has stopped supporting Windows 10 and has released a third version of Windows 11. To continue using Windows as an operating system, you are expected to buy a new computer!!!!

However, older machines can be installed with the Google OS, this free software can be downloaded, installed onto a USB and installed on your PC replacing Microsoft Windows.

CHRISTMAS LUNCH AT TRENCREEK FOR COFFEE CLUB MEMBERS AND THEIR FRIENDS





WHEN GRANDFATHER WENT TO GAZA

Way back in 1972 our company devised a puppet interpretation of Sergei Prokofiev's symphonic tale for children, *Peter and the Wolf.* The Russian composer intended it as an introduction for young people to the different instruments of the orchestra. Each character in the story has a particular instrument and its own musical theme. Our additional intention was to use the piece to serve as an introduction to various types of puppets. They were very simply made so that children could replicate them and devise their own ideas. The bird, played by the flute, was just a small bunch of feathers crafted onto the end of a long flexible stick; the duck (oboe) a cut

-out shadow puppet projected onto a screen at the back of the stage; the cat (clarinet) was a rod puppet made with a cloth-covered *Slinky* toy; and so on. They were all about three-quarters life-size so Grandfather (bassoon) made of cardboard tubes was a string marionette standing about 4'6" high.

The production very soon became the most performed piece in our school touring repertoire. Also, because it was a musical piece with minimal narration, it proved very suitable for our trips to several non-English speaking countries. We even took it 'coals to Newcastle' fashion' to Moscow!



In 1993 Joan and I were booked via the British Council to perform the production on a ten-day tour of Palestine. At Heathrow we found (even then) that El Al's security was much tighter than other airlines.

Our puppets, staging etc were packed in three special boxes. One of these we referred to as 'the coffin' because of its shape: approximately 1' x 1' x 6' long. At the airport we were obliged to open the other two boxes for examination because they were too big to go through the X-ray machine. As usual, the officials found the contents rather strange and we had to explain in some detail that they were the sets and props for performing *Peter and the Wolf*. Meanwhile, the 'coffin', which contained the puppets, was lifted onto a conveyor belt. We watched it being drawn slowly through an opening leading to a screened-off area –it was a bit like being in a crematorium.

Suddenly, there was a high-pitched female scream "there's a hand!" The X-ray had picked up one of Grandfather's hands, which was only slightly smaller than life-size. Everything immediately froze around us. By way of explanation. I said to the officials "that must be Grandfather"; which only made matters worse! The 'coffin' was quickly dragged back out and I was ordered to remove the lid. The unsmiling officials were eventually placated and allowed us to board the overnight flight, the last passengers to do so.

A British Council representative met us at Tel Aviv airport and drove us, with our boxes, to Jerusalem. It was very early morning, the sun was only just coming up and for most of the way there was no other traffic. Joan, a *Capricorn*, especially remembers seeing some Bedouins with goats as we passed through gently undulating

countryside; a scene probably unchanged since biblical times. The city of Jerusalem gradually appeared in the distance raised on higher ground. The sun was warming the pale sandy-coloured walls and reflecting off the gold -plated Dome of the Rock. It was all breathtakingly beautiful. We were literally 'going up to Jerusalem'.

Our hotel was near to the Damascus Gate which enabled us to explore and experience the sights and smells of the old city during our free time. We gave performances at Jericho, Nazareth and Jerusalem and several other places we'd never heard of. The venues included schools, a YMCA building, an ex-cinema and the Palestinian National Theatre.

We were driven in UN vehicles and were surprised when we crossed a border the first time. The driver stopped and changed the number plates! Apparently, Palestinian youths were liable to throw stones at vehicles with Jerusalem plates. Between times our hosts took us to the Church of the Nativity at Bethlehem and other biblical sites.

It soon became obvious that we were there at a rather tricky time. It coincided with the famous handshake of Yasser Arafat and Yitzhak Rabin in America, and the Oslo Accord when both states agreed to recognise the other's legitimate existence. The situation was tense because there were large numbers of extremists on both sides who were vehemently opposed the idea.

We saw the very high, much-graffitied, dividing wall as we drove into Gaza and passed sorrowful-looking refugee camps which we were told were occupied by Palestinians who had been displaced from their homes by Israeli settlers. We didn't see any obvious terrorists; but our hosts probably made very sure of that; instead we were taken to visit the homes of a few ordinary folk. I recall a graphic artist who gave us samples of his work and a farmer with an olive grove who made and sold olive oil which we sampled. So, on the whole, we found the Palestinians, although poor, very generous peace-loving people.

Our homeward journey was uneventful, Grandfather and all the puppets came back safe and sound, unaltered by their experiences; but we came back having learnt something about the turbulent Israeli/Palestinian history and politics – probably traceable to the time of Abraham. The puppets have taken us to many places; the Palestinian trip was one of the most memorable –a trip of a lifetime.




Sheila's response: It was a total surprise to receive my special gift. I am truly grateful and has been already said "lost for words" is not often in Sheila's vocabulary.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH NOTES

Is there anything you can't get a scam on? No. We've already had the fake Amazon calls; the parcel that can't be delivered text messages; the WhatsApp not really your relative messages, and now - the TV licence reminder email.

If you get one of these then it is bound to be a SCAM. But do check what they laughingly call your licence number. Do they use your name? Of course not. If you pay by periodic Direct Debit, don't panic. Verify with your bank that everything is ok.

If you have a WhatsApp group on your phone then you should know who they are. Isn't that the point of a group? So a fraudster phoning up pretending to be one of your group should stand out like a sore thumb. Strange folk make strange requests, like asking you to accept a 'one time pass code'. At that point IT'S A CON. Accept that code and all your personal and banking information is tantamount to be LOST. Hang up, it's a SCAM.

One of our villagers has recently had both the TV licence email and the "unable to deliver your parcel" scams. What next? The fake Amazon call.

Be wary of things you didn't start. If they are phoning you, ask yourself WHY? Then put the phone down, or delete the email, or send the text to 7726.

Now all we have to look forward to is this January and February on the way to spring and maybe some decent weather. Not too wet, not too hot, gardeners for the use of.

I know it's a bit late now, but if you are going away for a few days, do make sure your home looks occupied - not just closed up - no lights - curtains never pulled. If you can get a neighbour to draw the curtains and have lights on and off at various times it helps the house look lived in. It helps to deter burglars.

Keep your things locked, cars, sheds, garages. Anything with value in them. Keep stuff from view when shopping.

It's yours - don't let them have it.

OUR LOCAL RESIDENT MIKE BOSWORTH ENTERTAINER!

The Reverend Sabine Baring Gould was an exceptional parson and squire from Devon. He is probably best remembered as the composer of the hymns 'Onward Christian Soldiers' and "Now the Day is Over".

Born in Exeter in 1834, some 90 years later he died in 1924 at Lewtrenchard Manor, his estate in West Devon. Therefore 2024 will see the centenary of his death, and in the period before it and into 2024 I am taking the opportunity to spotlight what he considered to be the most important achievement of his life. That of collecting the old folk songs of Devon and later Cornwall, 'from the mouths of the people' to use his own words.

His foray into collecting folk songs started in 1888 as a dinner guest at the house of his friend Mr Daniel Radford of Mount Tavy. Over dinner the subject turned to if any of the guests knew any of the old Devon folk songs? Some of those present knew the hunting song "Arscott of Tetcott" and some knew, "Widecombe Fair." But none could recall others in their entirety.

Sabine said, he remembered how, when he was a boy, he had ridden round Dartmoor on his pony and had put up at little taverns. In them he had seen men sitting and had heard them sing ballads. Daniel Radford the host of the evening said to Sabine, 'Come you are the man to undertake the job of collecting these songs and airs.

But where to start?

Why not ask the good people of Devon if they knew any of the old songs?

He wrote a letter to the Western Morning News who published it on the 28th September 1888, asking their readers if they knew any of the old Devon Folk songs.

It worked..... he was inundated with letters from readers with countless versions of Widdecombe Fair and a few others but proved very successful.

Sabine realised that the response he had received was from those of the middle & upper classes who may have learned the songs as children from their servants. Just as he had as a child from his nurse when the family lived in Bratton Clovelly. They were not from the lower orders as the likes of the pub singers he remembered hearing sing from his Dartmoor travels as a teenager.


James Parsons known as "the Singing Machine" was not in my parish. Hearing of his vocal exploits, I sent for him one winter, and many a cheerful evening did we have together, he sitting in the settle by the hall fire, with a little table before him, singing and sipping hot spiced wine and water. He told me that when first invited to Lew House, he trembled with fright, but he soon got over that and came to relish his evenings with me. He was very strict with me, and insisted on my taking down the airs correctly.

That evening James Parsons first sang to Sabine at Lew Trenchard would have been in the late summer of 1888. That is where the collecting of old Devon and Cornwall songs began for this exceptional Devon Parson and Squire, known as the Squarson.

I am now taking bookings for appearances in 2024 of a 90-minute

performance of songs, tunes and stories from the Baring-Gould collection.
