I am also an (ex)-farmer, a wife to Chris, and mum to five youngsters. I am just beginning to get to know Bridgerule and I hope that over the coming months I shall be able to meet many of you.



It was a really good introduction to the village of Bridgerule to visit your History Day in the Community Hall in February. The displays were most informative and I found it an enjoyable introduction to the village. I also enjoyed meeting some of the community shop volunteers and the potential of what will become a welcome and valuable local service.

I have met a few of you at one of your fortnightly coffee mornings. What a wonderful opportunity for me to introduce not just myself but also the Tiny Teddies I take into schools to the reception year pupils! Thank you to all who have volunteered to knit teddies, they are welcomed with delight by the youngsters and schools alike. *The Editor of the Buzz, Sheila, has a copy of the pattern for anyone who would like to knit the teddy.* 

I have been asked to write a little about myself for your magazine and so here is a brief summary of my life journey which has brought me to Bridgerule. I attended Okehampton College before working in agriculture on two farms in Cornwall. I settled back in Devon on the livestock farm from where I married and where our family grew up. Alongside working on the farm with a growing family, I started to attend our local village church because I wanted to learn more about Christianity. This led me to becoming baptized, then confirmed, and learning to take part in services. I enjoyed helping out, putting on events and leading children and youth groups at a nearby village hall with a wonderful team of enthusiastic volunteers. After a while I sensed God calling me to do more in the church and so I began training through the Church of England. This led me to study for a degree in theology through St John's, Nottingham, which was completed at Exeter University. I became an ordinand in 2012 for my formal training towards the priesthood. In 2014 I started working full-time as a church minister (curate) in Bude and more latterly in Launceston (vicar), working both in town and village parishes. We moved to Holsworthy in November where I was appointed as the Anglican parish priest for the Holsworthy Benefice which includes Bridgerule & Pyworthy with Pancrasweek as well as Holsworthy & Hollacombe.

I am very happy to be here and I am thoroughly looking forward to settling into the local community, sharing with you in worship at the various churches, and sharing in your various events. There is much to learn and meet and do - and I have discovered an enormous amount of goodwill in the area to help me on the way. Thank you for your kind and generous welcome.

I finish with a Celtic blessing from one farmer to a community of farmers:



#### **Computer & Mobile Phone Battery Dangers**

I was asked to repair a faulty laptop which had issues with the keypad and mouse keys. Often this is a driver issue and when reinstalled the offending bits invariably work correctly.

Not so on this occasion!

I opened the system to expose the battery, it was a 12v flat Li-ion a type used in most modern laptops, the ultra-thin design allows the manufacturer to reduce the overall thickness of the laptop, making it sleek and lightweight.

This issue was that the battery had blown and swollen, a sign that the battery could explode and possibly self-ignite.

My thoughts were taken to the two electric London buses and other electric cars which had all recently caught fire as their batteries exploded. The swollen battery was pressing on the connections of the touchpad and mouse keys causing the malfunction. Replacing the battery resolved the issue.



As more of this type of battery are required many Chinese fakes are flooding the market, they are cheaper than the branded product. However, it was as a HP branded battery I had to replace. Therefore, both generic and branded batteries may be equally at risk.



It prompted me to check all battery powered systems, I was please I did, an old XGODY mobile phone had broken into pieces, its battery had swollen to twice its size. I dropped it into a bucket of water, blown batteries become less volatile as the build-up of gases dissipate in the water. It may seem a bit "Heath Robinson" but its quick, easy, low cost and it works!

Lithium-ion batteries can explode or catch fire due to a phenomenon called thermal runaway. This is a chain reaction and occurs when the battery experiences an

increase in temperature. The risk of this happening is supposed to be low, about 1 in 10 million cells, the average battery has 3 cells. The risk therefore is about 1 in 3.3 million batteries.

As there are about 100 million systems in the UK, the risk is down to about 33 units and I had 2 of them. I must just be unlucky or perhaps the data is incorrect!

The moral of this story is if your system uses a Li-on Battery and is hot when in use, or is constantly on charge, get your system checked out.

Almost all mobile phones and batteries are made in China if there is conflict in the China seas, as is feared, batteries, mobile phones, Tablets and IPads will be in short supply!

If you need help with the normal things of life in the day or at night, you may be eligible. Phone 0800 731 0122 for a form to apply. If you are given Attendance Allowance it is dated from your phone call.


