Now we are into Summer Holiday time. Please let a neighbour know you are away and ask them to keep an eye on your property. Give them a phone number or email address to contact you if any problems arise.

Should they notice anything amiss then they should call the police immediately. If you are leaving lights on a timer they need to know, but if the curtains get closed when no one is supposed to be there call 999.

And whilst you are away don't get caught by phone scams. Did you see the channel 5 piece on phone scams? Don't give any card or bank details to anyone who calls on your phone, mobile or landline. No matter who they say they are!

If, however, you are worried that you have succumbed, call 159, just 159. This puts you through to the fraud section of your bank, where you can explain what has happened and hope to stop it.

On another note, do not believe you are being called by some police station saying you have been conned.

In our village there has been phone calls to someone where the they tried to identify themselves as police officers.

This was also shown on the evening Spotlight programme.

Unfortunately for the callers they were phoning an ex-police officer who could question them and find their answers faulty.

Asking for badge number and home station puts them on the back foot. And not being local they can have difficulty pronouncing local towns.

Anyway the police don't phone you from the Serious Crime Squad, or whatever, it's a con, a scam, put the phone down. Wait 5 or so minutes and call 101 or 999 to let the real police know.

They are unlikely to text you. If you get a strange message on the lines of please do me a favour ..." it's not going to be your nearest and dearest, even if they say they are.

Just some scum wanting your money, one way or another. You can forward this text to 7726. It spells SPAM and might just as well spell SCAM for what it's worth.

IMPORTANT - PLEASE READ

Proposed Crematorium next to the A39

Planning Application

Many residents of Bridgerule will be aware of a planning application lodged with Cornwall Council for the construction of a Crematorium just off the A39 near Poundstock. The proposed site is next to the road to Widemouth Manor, so it is relatively close to Bridgerule.

The planning reference on Cornwall Council's website is PA21/01480.

The Application is due to be considered by Cornwall Council on 21 July 2022. As at the time of writing over 400 comments on the Application have been made, the vast majority opposing it, but more objections are urgently needed.

Why should I object?

There are a number of valid reasons for objecting to the Application (regrettably not the likely fall in property values if the application is granted) and you may think that, out of sight, out of mind. However, one of the main reasons for objecting is the high likelihood of toxic emissions from the Crematorium impacting on the area, including Bridgerule.

What are the likely Health Impacts of Toxic Emissions?

There is a growing body of evidence that operation of the Crematorium will result in emissions to air which have the potential to impact on local airquality in terms of both human and ecological receptors.

Toxic emissions from crematoria include carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, sulphur dioxide, volatile organic compounds, particulate matter and fine dust, organic pollutants and heavy metals such as mercury. Such toxic emissions have been shown to lead to increased risks of heart disease, lung cancer, asthma and adverse birth outcomes.

Where might these Toxic Emissions land? Toxic pollutants have been identified by a number of studies in soils downwind of crematoria. Wind speeds in this area are much higher than the national average and therefore toxins can be carried much further. With the prevailing wind being from the Southwest, Bridgerule is potentially in line to receive toxic emissions from the Crematorium.

What other reasons are there for opposing the Application?

There are many other valid reasons for objecting to the Application, including:

- The proposed development is an alien feature in an area that is heavily reliant on tourism.
- The development is inappropriate, being close to a Heritage Coast, an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and an Area of Great Landscape Value.
- The development is not sustainable it will require car transport to reach the site. To suggest public transport would be suitable is, frankly, laughable.
- The development is not environmentally sustainable even on the applicant's own evidence of likely traffic.
- The development is contrary to a number of Cornwall Council's planning policies.

What can I do to oppose the Application?

Write an objection response on Cornwall Council's planning portal. The link can be found here:

Some time ago, Microsoft informed the world, Internet Explorer version 11 will be retired, and on June 15th last, it did! For many it will not be an issue, but for some users, both large and small, it will cause problems. Some 3rd party software and internet remote services will cease to operate, or malfunction. Microsoft suggests you migrate to its Edge Browser. Also,

AMAZON is removing a crucial feature from older Kindle devices, the ability to purchase books from the Amazon Store will be blocked on a number of devices. From August 2022, users of several old Kindle systems will lose the ability to purchase an eBook directly from their device. Amazon is informing affected customers with emails warning of the upcoming Amazon Store block. It affects Kindle second to fifth generation models.

Printers continue to malfunction due to the continued updates and patches issued



by Microsoft, the necessary updates, designed to block hackers from gaining control of your computer, has forced an increasing number of users to upgrade their printers. These updates also cause systems to slow down, and some older low resource machines to lock up when installed on your computer. Dozens of updates have been released in recent weeks and there is no likely hood of it stopping anytime soon. Millions of hacks hit the

internet every day and some will find their way onto your computer!

This has brought to light an issue, as the Government expects us to download and print documents and forms which can be completed, signed and posted to the appropriate office. Some active PDF forms can be completed and submitted "online". However, a word of caution here, when asked to sign and confirm the document, signing in the appropriate section on the monitor screen will do no more than damage the screen. Replacing a damaged screen will cost anything upwards of £100 as has been experienced by one lady user recently.

Back to the Hackers, recent government initiatives have prompted a number of scams, suggesting you complete an email form or contact a telephone number and give your bank details over the phone to allow you to receive your allotted grant. Be warned - IT'S A SCAM! You will not receive a payment from the Government, you will lose everything held in your Bank Account!

BUDE LITERARY FESTIVAL

'Our own **Gautam Das** living in Bridgerule for over a year and a keen member of our Table Tennis Club gave two Talks at the first ever Bude Literary Festival on Friday 20th May and kept two audiences enthralled. His first talk was held in Bude's Library and was about his



book "Tender is the Scalpel's edge giving an insight into his early years as a surgeon and the various hospitals he had worked at. Gautam later invited questions from the floor and all of them took us further into his extremely interesting life with many lives saved along wav. Gautam's second Talk contained the life of Elizabeth Veale born here in Bridgerule 1766 and telling us that she married John Macarthur in St. Bridget's Church and sailed to Australia at age just 23 never to return. Gautam quoted several times from Michelle Scott Tucker's book (Elizabeth Macarthur - 'A life at the edge of the World) emphasizing her extreme courage and the huge success she had with farming and the production of Merino sheep. He told us that the Macarthur's ended up with 43,000 acres of Australian farm land and of their successful exporting of wool. The Macarthur's were so highly thought of they were commemorated on various Australian bank notes and medals. In the audience were people from Bridgerule, Pyworthy and Holsworthy and beyond with one interesting lady who had lived in Australia and heard Michelle interviewed on Australian radio. Again there were lots of questions plus an interest in some of the research laid out on a table for all to see. Bridgerule Parish Council are soon to order a picnic table to be situated near the bridge that will have a commemorative plaque attached giving information about our famous Elizabeth.'

Thanks to Gautam for his most interesting talks and done with no notes. For your fondness of our village and for the research done on Elizabeth Veale.




