NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH NOTES



Now that you are back from holiday, is it time to see that your passwords are worth it? Hope-

fully no one uses "password" as their password. Do try and include UPPER & lower case letters, and maybe a symbol, beyond a question mark, and a number or two. After all cyber crime is the thing nowadays. Why try theft or doorstep cons, when you can sit in front of the world's worst invention, your computer, and try to thieve money?

The best form of password is 8 to 12 characters. With a number and symbol with upper and lower case letters, a 12 digit password would take a computer
34,000 years to decode. Same pattern but only 10 digits the same machine, I'm told, would take 5 years. Only 6 characters-instantly. Frightening.
You have to remember it as well !

• The neighbourhood watch crime reports always make distressing reading. Frequently a casual thief will just pick up anything left lying around - phone; jacket; handbag; wallet or car keys. With the latter all the criminal has to do is press the "open" button and see which vehicle responds (as in New Tricks a night or two back.) With luck no person hiding inside.

• Devon and Cornwall continue to be one of the safest places to live work and visit in this country, with the second lowest crime rate in England. But the Alert doesn't say who is better. A lot of crime fell below the usual during the last two years of the pandemic. Since the return to almost normal life, the crime rate is rising again, but we are still second lowest in England.

The police continue to watch for drug distribution and taking under the "County Lines" operation. As always look after your stuff and look after your neighbours to keep yourselves crime free.

Tracking Software can steal your personal information

Over the past few years, I have been warning computer users of the dangers of tracking software, and I am sad to say it has become necessary to beat the drum, even harder, as they are used in many websites without your knowledge!

Why? I shall explain more, but first let me tell what a tracker is.

A tracker is a piece of code written in one of several languages often in java script. It is placed in a website which will, when connecting to that website, dump the code in the history files of your browser and designed for no other purpose than to watch, listen and record your data!

All very innocent, you may think, until it begins to spawn, monitor and relay everything you may be doing on your computer, sending it back to a server somewhere in the world, even when the browser has been closed down, a tracker will remain active.

Now, for those who tell me they have nothing to steal and there is nothing in their computer of any importance, I have recently identified a tracker on a customers computer that can listen into conversations, like Echo, Cortana and others. It is also well known that a tracker can activate a web cam and watch and listen into conversations from your Computer, Tablet or Mobile phone, when in the same room!

They are extensively used in TikTok, Facebook, Instagram, Booking.com, other travel websites and survey websites amongst many others, even websites from high profile and respected institutions, and they may not know they exist either.

Tiktok for example is operated by ByteDance a Chinese tech company based in Beijing, reportedly data entered on the system is transferred to servers in China. What happens to that data is open to speculation and your guess is as good as mine! If completing an online survey, you cannot guarantee some entity is not harvesting more information than you are asked to provide, and you may ask why? Often the data collected is sold on to a 3rd party.

Once a Tracker is on your system, and you won't know if one has infected your system, you need a cleaning program to clear them, these can be downloaded from malwarebytes.com,

Ccleaner.com or Wisecleaner.com and are free to use. Although you are encouraged to buy the premium versions, the free versions work equally well. Ideally it is better to block Trackers from entering your system and by installing Browser extensions, I have used Ghostery, Badger and Ad Blocker Ultimate for many years and are all free to download and use, they will stop all trackers, nuisance adverts or zombie cookies from clogging up your system.



But don't be lulled into a false sense of security thinking a password protects your system, IT DOES NOT! Computer passwords are relatively easy to override and bypass, but what you won't see are infections coming in through a back door and bypassing your Anti-Virus software. Some A-V's also have blind spots.




