Village Hall – Progress at last!

The Village Hall is at last being modernised. In only a few weeks the main hall has been completely transformed with new insulated walls, improvements to the electrical system to enable future improvements and a fantastic new suspended ceiling with new lighting.

An enthusiastic group of painters have done a marvellous job of painting the hall, the stage and the foyer and the cleaners have cleared all the dust and debris and mopped the floor a hundred times to bring it back to life!

We hope the planning permission for the new windows, guttering and fascia boards will be approved in July so we can go ahead and order them in good time to complete the rest of the work planned for this year. The hall should be much warmer this winter! We are already getting quotes for the next stages of the work which will include renewing the toilet facilities and providing a new meeting room and catering facilities.

Before this goes ahead we need to raise more funds so as well as applying for more grant funding we will be launching an appeal in the September Buzz for donations towards the project. We are now approved by HMRC as a Charitable Company so we can use the Gift Aid system to reclaim tax paid on any donations. This means we will get £25 for every £20 received!

Please do come along during revel week and see what we have been doing. The windows won't be finished by then but we will be showing details of what we hope to achieve and the old metal windows will at least serve as a reminder of how bad it used to be!

Finally a very big thank you to everyone who has helped in any way – we're getting there!

HOLSWORTHY GOLF CLUB

The club was formed in 1937 as a nine hole course and became 18 holes in 1981 and so in golfing terms it is relatively young and therefore celebrated 75 years of age in 2012 ! The history is unique because in 1936, a wealthy draper, Bill Coombe, was refused membership at Bude Golf Club because he was "in trade". He and a solicitor friend Stanley Rowland (his son, James Rowland is still a member to this day!), decided to form their own golf club at Holsworthy and negotiated a 10 year lease on 80 acres of very rough land at £30 per annum with an option to buy the freehold for £600.

The club began with just 24 men and 6 lady members and the "clubhouse" was an old beach hut bought for£1! Membership and income increased and in 1943, the freehold was purchased for £580.The war years saw part of the land ploughed for crops as part of the "Dig for Victory " campaign. In 1975, the new clubhouse was built with a major extension completed in 2007. Golf clubs in general in the UK have been struggling and HGC has been through some tough times but things are looking up ! The new golf professional, Joe Jordan , started work here on 22nd April, the course itself is looking good under the care of Kevin Piper and his team and Jacquie Carter as Manager along with the Club Committee are looking to steer the club forward. The food and beverage offering from Charlotte Greenwood and her team at Woody's is also gaining a great reputation with members and visitors.

There are exciting developments about physical changes in the club with the new internal access to the Pro Shop, new golf course machinery being supplied by Toro, new website, new signage and above all, a desire to increase membership with some excellent offers and the joy of any visitors who drop in to sample the goods!

In these tough economic times, HGC has had to look at all aspects of cost but at the same time offer a value for money product to members and guests......the "lifestyle memberships schemes" are proving to be very popular addition already, it is the young people that are the future of any golf club and relationships are being developed with Holsworthy Primary School, Bradworthy Primary Academy, Pyworthy Primary School and Holsworthy Community College and Shebbear College to increase the golf activity of our Juniors under the stewardship of Simon Moore. We have some excellent membership rates for Juniors which you can see on the website and in addition, we have recently approved a new junior first year fee of £15 !

Spotlight on Mr John Hammond.....

John Hammond was born in Cheveley, Newmarket in April 1927. He was the son of a headteacher and his mother was a nursing sister. His first memories are of being taken to a hunt and being surrounded by all the hounds in his pram. When John was a young lad, an all girls' school from Catford were



evacuated to the village where his father was in charge, together with their teachers. Each family had 2 evacuees join them except John's. His family had 2 teachers! (how lucky was John) One day John became aware that some of these girls had a hen sitting on some of their own eggs in the hope of hatching some chicks. He told them that they would never get any baby chicks because they had no cockerel. A few days later a message got back to John's father saying if Mrs Jones wanted her girls to have a sex lesson she would have asked for it!

Unhappy with the progress John was making in the local primary school his dad made arrangements for him to go to a private boarding school in Crambrook, only coming home on school holidays. At Crambrook the BBC presenter and Sports Commentator, the late Peter West was John's House Captain.

At the age of 16 all John longed to do was to work with animals on a farm. To start this process he began working as a student at the Kent Farm Institute in Sittingbourne. His first job was cavey threshing followed by hoeing rows of beans by hand with two elderly employees. John thought he could hoe much quicker than the two mature men but at the end of the day he struggled to keep up.

Most of John's holidays were spent with his grandfather on a small holding, helping with the sheep and the harvesting of fruit. For this he was paid 6d a week. John soon found out that another of granddad's employees were being paid £5 a week and confronted him. The upshot of this was that granddad said he did not only provide work for John but also fed him. Nevertheless John's wages then rose to 2/6d. In November 1945 John annoyed his father by joining the Marines at Lympstone. Within a month of joining he contracted meningitis and was admitted to Whipton Isolation Hospital, resulting in all Christmas leave being cancelled for every marine. Upon John's complete recovery he became a cook in No5. Cook House, helping to prepare food for 200 marines.

John was then posted to Egypt for 2 years. He recalled sleeping in a hammock aboard the flight deck of the aircraft carrier 'Indomitable' amongst his sweaty fellow marines and so decided to move on to the outside where the air seemed cleaner but the result was of being rocked so much so that he almost ended up in the 'drink'. So for safety sake only, from that day on he moved a little closer to his mates! 6 months after returning from Egypt, John now a Lance Corporal, was demobbed. In 1966 John moved to Kent and became a herdsman, starting work each day 5.00am and having only half a day off a week. He later became livestock manager for 3 dairy herds, 2 calf units and 1 beef unit; in total a 1000 head of stock. It was while John was working here that he became very interested in the showing of cattle. On one particular day whilst John was driving a tractor down the lane he met someone driving a very expensive looking car. The driver in fact was a young Paul McCartney who was taking a short cut to his home.

Twelve years later John moved to Rye in Sussex on a farm of 300 acres owned by Hurlingham Investments. He was appointed farm manager but with no stock or machinery on the land at the time, John was given a blank cheque to purchase all he needed for it to become a working farm. After a while he began to breed and show Sussex bulls, entering four shows a year including The Royal. In 1980 one of his bulls became Supreme Champion at the South of England Show in Ardingly. Another bull then became Beef Champion and went on to win the much sought after Queens Cup in the same show and John was actually presented with the trophy by

H.R.H. Queen Elizabeth.

To relax John enjoyed sequence dancing and in 1985 at one such dance he met his wife to be Jean. Sometime after, the couple moved to Surrey where John became an estate bailiff on a 1000 acre estate owned by a Mrs. Diana Barnato-Walker MBE and Master Fox Hounds. This lady was the first woman

pilot to go through the sound barrier during the war. Her father was one of the Bentley Boys and her grandfather a diamond millionaire. John was also asked at this time by a horse dealer to ride with the Old Surrey and Burstow hunt with the view of showing and selling some of the dealers horses. After 2 years John and Jean decided to move to Cornwall and in 1987 they set up home at Wainhouse Corner where Jean had a bed and breakfast business for ten years and John spending some of his time whilst there steeping hedges on the Bude Canal. In 1997 they moved to Kildare

Bridgerule where they live today and here John began to display the hand tools he had begun to collect. John's favourite hand tool being the hammer and he has 300 of them! Jean recalls that at one particular sale John left her to look after a rusty jalo, a push hoe, he had just bought, whilst he went off again to buy what turned out to be 8 flat irons. Quite quickly Jean found herself surrounded by some very interested males but she quickly realised it was the jalo that was attracting them! Both John and Jean have always





enjoyed their gardens and John has been successful over a long period in entering his flowers, dahlias in particular, and vegetables in various shows. Both John and Jean are founder members of Holsworthy Vintage Club and enjoy going on holidays abroad. Three years ago they went on a cruise to the Suez Canal and the pyramids to revisit where John had served as a marine. Earlier this year they visited Holland. They have opened their gardens on more than one occasion for the benefit of others with many visitors enjoying John's huge collection of antique hand and garden tools to which he is still adding to.

Some years ago John said that he would like to be able to paint, in particular to be able to paint a tree. So he enrolled at The Gregson Centre. John learnt how to paint a tree and Kildare now houses a collection of very colourful pictures that have been painted by John. John and Jean also regularly support events in our village.

On behalf of The Buzz I thank both John and Jean for the interview and for their most generous donation to our Village Hall. I wish them both well.
