

Holsworthy Walk and Talk

Here we are with Christmas behind us and 2019 to look forward to. A New Year generally brings resolutions including losing some of the excess festive calories and 'getting a bit fitter'. Our walks are an ideal way to address physical fitness with the added bonus of improving psychological wellbeing and raising the spirits.

Evidence continually adds to the list of benefits of walking in the prevention, management and rehabilitation of long-term conditions including cancer, Type II diabetes and heart disease. Our walks also benefit our pockets as they are FREE.

Our January programme has a good mix of terrain and scenery. The Bude Canal walk will take us from the Canal out onto the Coastal Path, subject to safe conditions. The first Tuesday everyone met at the lovely Christmas tree opposite the Bridge Inn which Pam and Gary the Publicans kindly supply every year to brighten up the village.

Father Christmas was kept busy from his decorated sleigh waving to everyone and this was ably pulled by reindeer (Bill Eastcott) dressed as a reindeer and sat on his brightly lit quad bike. Carols were sung mainly in the centre of the village and the singers returned to the Primary School where FOBS (Friends of Bridgerule School) supplied mulled wine and mince pies.

On the second Tuesday there was a larger crowd of Carollers and they sang for residents of Littlebridge Estate and Southfields estate where they were welcomed with plenty of treats including sherry and mince pies etc. A huge thank you to all the singers who put up with very cold conditions and to the many warming treats supplied by residents of Bridgerule. Thanks also for very generous contributions slipped into the 2 collecting boxes. The total was a very pleasing £216 which divided between the Church, the Chapel and the School means that they all receive £72. Always a brilliant fun evening for all concerned and one that will be repeated next year.

JOHNNY COWLING EVENING

Johnny Cowling the very popular Cornish entertainer visited our village hall a few weeks ago. The hall was full to capacity. Johnny is an entertainer who likes to get among the audience during his performance— with many tales and yarns to spin. He also has a great singing voice which gets everyone dancing and clapping.

This great evening raised a profit of £1600 for hall funds.

Fran and Jill live in Bridgerule and have recently embarked on a holiday of a lifetime, lasting several months. These two lovely ladies have agreed that the readers of The Buzz can be part of their holiday.

We left Southfields on the 14th of October to catch an overnight ferry from Plymouth to Roscoff our first stop was an aire at Plouescat in Brittany (an aire in France is a specially designated



parking spot that fully contained campervans; for example has their own toilet and washing facilities; can park for a short period of time for free or a small fee. Plouescat was a lovely place with a large sandy beach, dune banks and piles of unusually shaped granite rocks that have been sculpted by the sea and wind into curvaceous shapes. The region is largely agricultural, specialising in artichokes, onions, cauliflowers and potatoes.



We then visited Cameret-Sur- Mer on the North Coast of Brittany. In 1694 Cameret Bay was the site of the naval battle between the French and the English forces. This ended in a disastrous landing by the English as part or an attempt to seize the nearby Brest.

We stayed in Morgat which traditionally was a quiet sardine fishing port before discovering tourism. The coast near Morgat is known for it's multicoloured sea caves due to the appearance of fluorescent minerals. There is also a coastal walk from Morgat to Cap de la chèvre which is much like our coastal paths in Bude very steep in places but worth the effort for the views.



We moved on to Nevez. Here we stayed in Raguenez which has such a lovely beach that the Neveziens citizens have christened it Tahiti. Whilst we were there we were lucky enough to see some amazing sun sets from the warmth of the campervan as the aire was situated next to the waters edge.





Next was il de ré, an island off the west coast of France (near La Rochelle) and best known for its salt marshes and oyster farms, beaches and cycle paths. It was great to get the bikes off and try out Tilly in the panniere, she loved the experience of being up high and having the wind through her ears! Of course while we were out we had to try an oyster or two! On our arrival to Meribel it has snowed on the very top of the mountains and more was forecasted for the next day.

Meribel is a ski resort in the french alps also called le trois vallees (because it is made up of three valleys) of which Meribel is the central one.



It is the largest ski area in the world with it's 370 miles of ski slopes.

The next day it did snow so we woke up with snow outside the doorstep of the chalet we were staying. Tilly was very excited.

The snow didn't stay long but then we were treated to the lovely Autumn colours of the mountains.



We have said goodbye to friends in Meribel and are now traveling through Italy hoping to be in Sicily by Christmas. Our route into Italy from France was via the tunnel de frejus which goes under a mountain range just south of the vanoise national park which also covers part of meribel it took 12 minutes to get through and we entered in lovely sunshine but exited to dark grey clouds! Our first destination is the town of Alba, northeast of cúneo which is famous to the Italians for white truffles and red wine.

The Alba white truffles are more delicate and aromatic than the black variety found further south and very expensive, a white truffle the size of a golf ball would set you back £200. The red wines are divided into two, the light and fragrant Nebbiolo and the more robust Barolo also called the "the king of Italian reds".

Our next stop lucca 17km northwest of Pisa is a lovely walled town that we had previously visited but were keen to return as inside the walls it is generally free from traffic so it's a great place simply to walk randomly through town and along the perimeter walls allowing an elevated view of inside and outside the walls. Then of course Pisa and it's leaning tower, although not as leaning now, as in 1990 for fear of collapse it was closed to the public. The tower was straightened by 45cm (17.7inches) returning it to its 1838 position and reopened to the public in 2001 and declared stable for at least another 300 years.





In the same area is the Duomo (an Italian cathedral), the Baptistry and the cemetery of the campostanto all of which are stunningly beautiful buildings of white marble.




