### **NEW EQUIPMENT FOR CHILDREN'S PLAY PARK**

Our Children's Play Park has always been popular but after the re-opening of it following the lockdown it became more popular than ever. This has not only been a happy place for children to come and play with siblings and friends but a safe and welcome meeting place for parents and friends after being forced to stay in their own homes for several months.

The Village Hall Committee became aware of this and approached the Parish Council, as custodians of the park, with a view of replacing some of the play equipment which was showing signs of wear and tear. The Parish Council gave their approval and the village hall committee applied for some specific grants towards the refurbishment.

As a member of the hall committee, Stacey Cholwill met with mums and children who used the park to seek out their ideas. Together they met, Ben, a representative of Play Force, builders of play parks and a plan was set out. The price of replacing such equipment is very costly and a further price increase expected in January. With £32000 accumulated, which included a £10000 donation from hall funds and £4000 already set aside in a parish council account an order was placed. The parish council

agreeing to reclaim the VAT. This alone is worth over £6000 and means the children can have the full benefit of the money raised.

### PARISH COUNCIL ELECTION 1946 18 candidates for 10 seats.

Much excitement prevailed in Bridgerule on Tuesday, the occasion of the first Parish Council election. The day had its humorous side. Some person or persons whilst the villagers were asleep, had painted witty slogans on all the tradesmen's windows. Mr Hooper was presiding officer, and Mrs E. Oke Holsworthy poll clerk. The polling station was at the Public Hall, where a large crowd gathered after 8.00 pm to wait the result, which was announced by Mr J.A. Churchill, Returning Officer.

The 10 councillors are; Messrs. F.C. Lucas 187, R. Bowden 170, E.G. French 170, C.J. Andrews 159, W.R. Curtis 159, W. Dodd 155, P.P. Pratt 141, C. Dinner 120, F.W. Moore 111, W.J. Martin 108.

The unsuccessful candidates were; A.T. Bowden 98, R.W. Loye 90, H.M. Martyn 89, P.W.A. Vinnicombe 84, D. Nolan 55, L.H. Hannaford-Hill 48, V.U. Connell 32, A.J. Nolan 19.

There were 1,995 votes cast - 84 per cent, of the electorate. Each candidate thanked the electors. Mr Lucas said his father had been chairman for Bridgerule East for 19 years. He took on after his father, and had been chairman 19 years this March, and was proud of the fact that parishioners placed such confidence in him as to elect him now.

### PICNIC TABLE AND PLAQUE TO COMMEMORATE OUR FAMOUS BRIDGERULE LADY. (By Rose Hitchings)

Bridgerule Parish Council are about to purchase a picnic table which will be positioned near to the river Tamar by the bridge - for all to use - and with a plaque attached as a memorial to our ELIZABETH VEALE.





Elizabeth Veale was born 1766 at the farm called Lodgeworthy - the entrance gate to the farmhouse and land is next to the school - and her home (still there today) is set on a slope overlooking Bridgerule. Her father died when she was about 6 years old and we understand she went to live with her Grandfather at Tackbeare Manor for a while. The vicar at this time was the Rev. Kingdon and Elizabeth was invited to be a companion to his daughter Bridget where together they attended lessons alongside his other children. Elizabeth lived with the Kingdon family at the vicarage until her marriage in 1788 when she was 22. Elizabeth Veale and Bridget Kingdon became life-long friends and it is from letters sent to each other and to Grace Veale (Elizabeth's mother) that much of her life has been researched and recorded.

Elizabeth's husband was John Macarthur who joined the New South Wales Corps in 1789 and together they boarded a ship 'Neptune' that would take them on a 6 month long hazardous journey to AUSTRALIA (with the second fleet). Conditions on this ship were terrible beyond belief - almost 500 convicts (men, women and children) were being held on the deck below (158 died before reaching Australia) and it was here on board ship that Elizabeth and John spent 2 months, including Christmas, in cold, cramped conditions on board before ever leaving England - she was just 24.

The couple finally set sail in January 1790 and with them was their infant son Edward - a sickly child, small for his age - and with Elizabeth pregnant with their second child - a girl who was to die during the voyage. They survived huge hardships on board, shortages of rations, maggots and vermin, very little water for drinking and keeping themselves clean, extreme heat and extreme cold, frightening storms that lasted days at a time and also had to endure many unpleasant arguments with the ship's captain Nicholas Nepean. So much so that at Cape Town in February the Macarthurs changed ship to the 'Scarborough' where conditions were much improved although both her husband and small child were very ill and needed day and night nursing.

Conditions were not a lot better when the ship arrived at Sydney Cove where Elizabeth and John found that their allotted home was little more than a wooden hut ... but over the years despite drought, near starvation and flooding the Macarthur's became huge land owners (43,000 acres in census of 1824) and famous for the production of merino sheep. Elizabeth managed several farms during her husband's absence when he had to return to England for 8 years - and it was she who was important in establishing Australia's wool industry. John and Elizabeth had 8 children and although in her letters she often wished to return to the place of her birth she never did - dying in Australia 1850 age 84.

Elizabeth and John Macarthur are remembered ... on an Australian bank note (John), a solid silver 5 dollar coin (1995) (Elizabeth), a medal (John) and a set of stamps (1934). There is an Elizabeth Macarthur Agricultural Institute - an Avenue named after her - a Park - and a School in her name. Elizabeth Farm, her first home is now owned by the New South Wales Historic Houses Trust.







Rose and the editor both feel that it is important for our children whom attend Bridgerule Primary School to learn about their own village heritage such as Elizabeth Macarthur and when convenient they will be going into the school to do just that.

The book 'Elizabeth Macarthur - A life at the end of the world' written by Michelle Scott Tucker gives an insight into the changing fortunes of this intriguing family. Michelle came to Bridgerule in 2014 and visited St. Bridget's Church - Lodgeworthy - Tackbear - The Mill and The Glebe. (The Glebe as we know it today was built about 1840 - after Elizabeth's time - but an earlier vicarage was built on this area of Glebe and where she stayed with the Kingdon family).
