

### Microsoft Office users vulnerable to hackers

MICROSOFT OFFICE users could be vulnerable to a new attack that lets criminal's takeover your computer remotely or install malware.

Microsoft users should be on alert for a dangerous hacking exploit. If you use Microsoft Office Word, Power-point, Excel & Outlook, make sure you install the latest updates from Microsoft to ensure you're guarded against hacks that could allow cybercriminals to remotely access and control your PC.

Microsoft software is full of holes (weak points in the program code) which can allow attackers an opportunity to execute their own code on your machine, this could lead to harvesting important credit or debit card details, or installing malware, ransomware, or other nasties on your computer.

To begin with a hacker needs to trick you into opening a specific file from an email, or link to a nefarious website. A remote code is then dumped on your system and will advise you to download updates from their site. If successful the hacker will then install programs; view, change, listen into conversations or delete data; or create new accounts with full user rights.

To counter this type of attack, download important updates from Microsoft directly. Click on the windows Start button (bottom left of your screen), click Settings and open Update and Security and activate Downloads. Then select Advanced Options and activate "Receive updates for other Microsoft products"

And that's it. From now on, Microsoft will install the latest Office updates and products onto your machine as soon as they are available. That means your



system will have the latest patches and fixes and more holes will be plugged to protect you from the millions of Thieves, Scammers, Robbers and the unscrupulous criminals who haunt the internet on a daily basis.

Many more users are finding "Alexa" to be overly intrusive especially at times when having a private conversation. The device is fitted with extremely sensitive microphones and listens

for commands. Many users find conversations interrupted as words are mistaken for commands. Which begs the question, If the device can listen into your conversations, who else can?

As spring approaches do make sure you don't have to call in the real police for burglary or theft or anything else that has been taken.


BRIDGERULE OPEN GARDENS



But we did not mind if banana's were straight, As long as yellow and given the correct weight. Were they banana's or were they plantains, It seemed to take a while to explain.

Stoic as ever, we tried our best to conform, But longing to return to the old English norm. But we felt all we had loved, going astray. The culture if our country fading away. For we are British and different since time began Times can change the rules, but not the man. For our love of England goes deep to the core, And we are British today, tomorrow and forever more!

### **MEG THE SHEEP DOG**

Becky Palmer lived in Dorasfield, Bridgerule from birth with her family until 2004, when she moved to Camelford and this is where she lives today. **Becky takes up the story.** 

Back in November 2010 I saw an advert for a litter of pup's in the Holsworthy Post. I went along to see them. There was only one left unsold . Little did I know that this little pup 'Meg' would change my life!



Initially I was looking for another collie to do agility with but Meg had other ideas. She comes from very successful sheepdog parents 'Lad' and 'Maid', who I got to see work when I went to see the litter. All she wanted to do was round things up. So, I bought books, DVD's, a whistle and some sheep and set about training my very first sheep dog. It wasn't easy! There were happy times and frustrating times, but I wasn't giving up. In the early days she wasn't very good at listening to me. She wanted to do things her way which was challenging including biting people and would grip sheep.

Once we'd put the basics in, 'come-bye' and 'away' the control came and she started to settle. Getting her to 'stop' felt like it was never going to happen, but we got there eventually. I got back in contact with her breeder (who trials sheep dogs) and with his help he pointed me in the direction of the local sheep dog trials and a man 'John Carter', who has helped me so much.

I joined the Cornwall Sheepdog Society and the International Sheep Dog Society. I was in awe of the people running their dogs at the sheep dog trials. I said to Meg 'that will be us one day'. Meg and I trained nearly every day from when she was 12 weeks old until we ran in our 1<sup>st</sup> nursery trial in 2011 when she was 13 months old. Meg was ready to start training really young, she was bored and getting very frustrated being a pet and needed a job. There are always people willing to offer help and advice and everyone on the trialing scene are so welcoming. Shortly after starting trialing I joined the committee of the Cornwall Sheepdog Society.

Our 1<sup>st</sup> trial didn't go as I'd hoped, I was really nervous. I left the field feeling deflated and at the time didn't understand why she didn't work like she did at home. The whole of that first season was used to gain experience. Soon, my control of Meg had improved. She became more settled working sheep in a trialing environment away from home. I let her down on the trial field numerous times, her experience of working sheep had over taken mine by a mile. I had a lot of catching up to do! But our hard work finally paid off when we finished our first nursery trial in Somerset coming 3<sup>rd</sup>. Meg had a litter of pups in 2013 (the one I kept sadly died in July 2015). The following April she ran through a gate and injured her back badly and had 8 months off work. This set us back a lot as we missed a season just as things were getting better for us. After lots of physiotherapy and rest she returned to full work in 2015 and we had some good placings .

The following year we won our 1<sup>st</sup> open trial at Brentor. The course was huge, there were over 50 dogs in the class, the weather was awful, heavy rain and fog. We also became eligible to run at the English National Sheep-dog trial. This is where the best 150 dogs in the country compete against each other over 3 days. In 2017 we won a trial very early on in the season and continued to get good placings. We did have to miss a few trials as Meg was diagnosed with skin cancer followed by mammary cancer and had 2 operations to remove them. Even so, we were classed as one of the top 3 Cornish dogs at the end of the open season and competed against the top 3 dogs from Devon in the 'Champion of Champions'. Amazingly we won and this was a turning point for us.

2018 sadly saw Meg suffer a fractured skull and had an operation for cancer but it was still a good season for trialing. Then just weeks before she was due to run at the English National Sheepdog trials she broke her toe; luckily she was healed just in time to go. Last season was our best yet, we started off with 3<sup>rd</sup> place at a trial at Meg's breeders, followed by 2 wins and a 5<sup>th</sup> at Cornwall's big open trial. This trial attracts handlers from all over the country, the continent and America and is held over 2 days on the

second weekend in May. There are 2 fields running at the same time.

In July 2019 we headed over to the Isle of Man for a 3 day trial attracting some of the country's best handlers and trainers and for a first prize of £1000. The temperatures were scorching so not ideal for working a dog. Meg and I had a really good run on the first day and got into the final. I went not expecting much, but to be able to come home and say that we'd beaten some of the best in the country is amazing. We didn't win the final but competing at that level was incredible. We're off again this July!

We had another win at a trial in Wadebridge in August before heading up to Yorkshire for the English National Sheepdog trials. In September Meg's uterus got infected meaning she had to have an operation to remove it. This meant no working or trialing for 6 weeks but she was back in action for the last 2 trials of the season. One of which was a double-fetch. Meg had to fetch one packet of sheep, bring them down the field then leave them and go and get another packet. We completed the course and came second. At the Cornwall Sheepdog Society's annual dinner and prize giving In 2018 Meg was voted best dog by the other handlers. Last year she was the most successful Cornish dog and won the season.

In recent years I have been judging trials. Not only is Meg a trial dog, her ability as a flock dog is excellent and she loves her flock work. She never backs down to sheep. She is a dab hand at catching sheep at lambing time and will work any type and number of sheep and thinks for herself. She has got me out of some tricky situations when moving sheep. I can stand in a gateway, send her to get sheep which are out of sight and she'll bring to me with just that one command. Meg will search for sheep hidden on the rocks on Roughtor when it's time to bring them in for lambing or shearing.

It takes about 18 months to 2 years to fully train a young dog. I am very lucky to have had the privilege to train dogs for other people over the years. I'm hoping to add two more sheepdogs in April, but these two pups will have very big boots to fill.






