
"I am very disappointed with the residents of Bridgerule who do not support the activities that go on in the village!

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH NOTES - John McDougall

In Bridgerule we are lucky to have so little crime of the type that gets reported to Neighbourhood Watch. Those crimes are, on the whole, burglary; damage of any sort; theft and anything to do with vehicles.

There are sorts of crime including harassment; fraud; anti-social behaviour and violence of all kinds which could result in murder. By being in Neighbourhood Watch and keeping an eye out for things, crime may be committed somewhere else. That is recognised. Move crime away from here.

There is little doubt that there will be people offer their services for repairs after storm Eunice, or others. Be wary. Anyone just knocking on your door could be what ? Good, bad, indifferent or simply a trickster.

If you need repairs tread carefully. Get quotes from people who have done your sort of repairs before. Ask your neighbours if they know of a reliable people.

Don't pay anyone in advance.

I hope that the spring will be good to us this year. Not so much March winds and April showers.

I have mentioned before the Alert scheme. Emails are sent on various matters relating to scams; thefts and missing persons etc.

To give the police information where no prompt action is required "torridge@devonandcornwall.pnn.police.uk"

You can follow Neighbourhood Watch on all the social media.

As I write it has been a horrible weekend and I hope you are as well and healthy as before the storms.

You will know that you can always call 999 if you see something happening that isn't right. Or phone Crimestoppers on 0800 555111 to give information.

If you think that you have been the subject of fraud contact Action Fraud on 0300 1232040 or email "actionfraud.police.uk" or "financialfraudaction.org.uk".

Don't open any attachments to emails if you really don't know who they are from.

Don't give anyone your card number or PIN unless you have contacted them - not if they contact you.

WORKING FROM HOME

They say an Englishman's home is his castle. Very often it doubles as a place of work.

It is absolutely permissible to use part of your home as a workplace.

If a part of your home is set aside **solely** for business use, then it's appropriate to contact the Valuation Office Agency who will assess that part of your home for non-domestic rates. It is only likely to have a minimal rateable value and if you don't occupy any other premises, you would be eligible to claim Small Business Rate Relief (at 100%).

If however, the room that you use for your business is also used for domestic purposes (for example a spare bedroom, dining or living room) then it would not be separately assessed and just continue to be part of your home.

The Bridgerule Work From Home Club has been set up to provide support, assistance and companionship to those who work from home in and around our village. Homeworking either by choice or by need, can sometimes be a lonely place and with so many of us in this position, the club is great way to meet new friends and take a break from normal weekly routines. Wi-Fi routers can be putting millions at risk

Using broadband in your home may be putting your personal data at risk by not paying more attention to your router.



The device that connects your computer to the internet can be an easy point of access to your personal files, especially if your router has not been changed or upgraded for a few years.



Having a secure alpha-numeric-symbol Wi-fi password is one thing, but a recent study has identified 84% of users never change the administrator user name or password, which in most cases is admin and admin and this can allow instant access to a hacker.

Now I am not suggesting for one minute that a neighbour may try to hack into your system, but come the holiday season, when the local population doubles, there is no telling who may be around the corner or parked a few yards down the lane and a wi-fi will emit a signal accessible up to 30 metres away.

We will spend anything between £30 and £80 a year on anti-virus software, which in some cases are completely useless, as not all block pirate adware or zombie cookies and we may stop all important firmware updates, because we do not know what they do or what they are. Switching off the router at night can be equally bad as BT for example will send updates in the small hours to avoid daytime disruption.

If your router hasn't been upgraded by your Internet Service Provider (ISP) in a while it may be helpful to contact them to get a new modern router with superior security, and if you let cottages to holiday makers wanting internet access, it may be wise to invest in a second system dedicated to casual users. Penny pinching on internet security these days, can become very costly in deed!

It's worth remembering, if someone can reach your Wi-Fi network, they can try logging into your router using only basic information. If successful, a whole new set of threats emerge, from spying on your internet usage to piggy backing bandwidth, or stealing sensitive data and installing malware.

Some people tell me they do not bank online, so they don't need extra security and they could not be more wrong!

Hackers do not wear masks and stripped vest and carry bags of swag! The most successful ones can be highly educated, university graduates, yet that doesn't stop them stealing your assets!




