




Dear Buzz Readers,



Solar Park Development

From another point of view



Are you aware of a proposal for yet another Solar Park development for Pyworthy which will be the largest in Devon?

- This will further and very markedly industrialise our area with high security fencing and CCTV cameras all round. Situated along from Bounds Cross on both sides of the road it is on the other side of Bridgerule and considerably bigger than Pitworthy Farm that already took a huge chunk of our farmland.
- The proposed Solar Park is enormous it is bigger than Vatican City which is a small country! It is 66 hectares (145 acres) in size. It could grow even larger in the future, as we have reason to believe that this may be phase one of a bigger project, which may be difficult to stop if this application is passed.
- Previous Governments have stated "that our local environments should not be trashed in order to protect our global environment".
- This proposal claims it will produce enough energy for 12,000 homes. Our immediate area already has 6 Solar Parks, which together we understand are capable of supplying over 45% of Torridge households electrical needs. If this new installation goes ahead, our local area could be supplying the equivalent over 80% of Torridge District household's total electrical energy needs.
- National Planning Policy states that local planners need to recognise the responsibility of ALL communities to renewable energy. Not just a very few. There is no reason why Bridgerule and Pyworthy should bear the damage to our landscape alone.
- There will be a major impact on the countryside to the southwest of Pyworthy Parish, creating dramatic changes to the landscape character, its tranquillity, views and glimpses of the wildlife, presenting us instead with a sea of glass and an industrial landscape particularly from the Yeomadon road but also from a lot of the houses in Bridgerule at Springfield beyond Furse Cross. The enjoyment of exercising and living in this area will be greatly and negatively affected. Security fences, panels and CCTV will be on both sides of the road that cuts between the areas significantly impacting the amenity value for walkers, cyclists and horse riders. North Devon recognises in its official Landscape Assessment that our landscape is Highly Sensitive to solar development greater than 10 hectares. This is over six times that size.
- 40% of this proposal utilises good agricultural land rated at 3a specifically designated by planning guidelines not to be used for such projects unless there is no alternative. Brownfield sites, poorer land and other areas of Torridge should all be looked at first if there is a need for more solar power plants in our district. Food security issues after Brexit mean that we should not be removing good land from food production and a very few sheep grazing slow growing grass in the shade and cool under the panels do not compensate for the reduction or loss of well-run dairy enterprises.

- Local tourism is likely to be damaged and long term jobs in farming and supporting businesses reduced over the 40 year lifetime. There is no evidence of local economic gain.
- If you feel at all strongly about this, please do write to the council to object either by letter or electronically to <u>planningsupport@torridge.gov.uk</u> quoting 1/0249/2021/FULM. If you do please refer to the material planning points above that planners are obliged to consider – the cumulative impact, the current contribution, the landscape character damage, the loss of agricultural land and the impact on the local economy.
- Please copy your letter if possible to the Parish Council and encourage them to object as the neighbouring parish,

Lost data - not really!

I was recently called to a customer, who's laptop had crashed resulting in a complete failure of the hard drive. The issue was, not that it was a virus which had caused the crash, but the photos which could not be accessed whereby over 10 years of images had been potentially lost forever. I say this as I was the last person in a list of others who had been asked to retrieve the data as those before me had failed.



There are three lessons to be learned, one is backup all your important data to a separate disc, the second is ask someone who knows what they are doing to retrieve the lost data. The third is to follow;

My customers disc is beyond future use as there are several damaged sectors but fortunately, I could format the disc and

wipe off all the surface data on the disc, leaving a seemingly blank disc. But with some ingenuity and very good software I could begin a deep scan of the disc and to the delight of the customer I was able to recover 20,000 plus images, plus all the documents and other historical data for the past 8 years, which most computer users would not be aware was there, or accessible!

I explained, everything you see on your computer screen from the moment you acquire it, and some you don't see, but has been downloaded onto the disc, is imprinted on the disc and even after it has been deleted and the disc formatted, an image of the data remains and is retrievable.



Large storage discs, which are rarely used to capacity, are ideal as the data is hardly ever over written and remains clean, without corruption and easy to retrieve. Perfect for data retrieval when your data is seemingly lost forever. Equally, prefect for the thief who may access your disc after you have disposed of your computer and learn your inner most secrets, passwords and bank details.

Sadly, with today's multi-media life style, data harvesting has become a very profitable business. Therefore, the third lesson must be to ensure the data on your system is fully irradicated correctly before innocently giving it to a 3rd party or sending it to a recycling centre to be disposed of.

When he left school he worked as a carpenter for Alf Blackman in Holsworthy.

With his friend Richard Chidley (Julie Trayford's brother) they decided to see more of the world. Their first adventure was to spend a few weeks in Grenada, after they met a friend who was going out to do some work there.

There next adventure was to Australia. They flew to Adelaide and stayed with Richard's aunt. They then bought a camper van and drove to Melbourne. It was in Melbourne that the two young men met two girls who they would then go on to marry.

Christmas was going to be spent in the camper van but someone on the building site at that time invited them to join his family for Christmas. After spending three months in Melbourne they drove on to Brisbane. On the way there they met up with Simon Wonnacott in Sydney. Simon had also lived in Bridgerule as a child, attended the school and his dad, Terry, still has his home in Bridgerule today.

They spent a few weeks with Mark's cousin, Rebecca Cann, in Brisbane. Then Simon Neep, someone else from Bridgerule flew out and spent a few weeks with them. Mark and Richard continued North to Cairns and visited Clyers Rock and Alice Springs. Richard then returned to Melbourne and Mark continued along the North Coast and eventually on to Perth where he worked for a while until returning to Melbourne.

Today he is living with his partner, Lana, and daughter Maddy on their forty acre farm in



Yarra Valley to the East of Melbourne. As well as the family ponies the farm is home to a variety of animals. Sheep, goats, pigs, and cattle who for



various reasons would have been slaughtered but now have a home forever with Mark. There is a charity in Australia called Edgars Mission, who take in animals that have had to have been rescued. If people like Mark and Lana take some animals in it

allows the Mission to rescue more animals. Occasionally kangaroos will call in. The WILD parrot (see photo) calls regularly on Mark and taps on his window to be fed.

Mark still runs his building business. He enjoys fishing and has made a motor bike track around the farm for him and his friends to enjoy. Mark

One of the Alerts concerns the "protect your car" campaign. Lock it, keep it empty of items on show and park in a well-lit area. 44% of vehicles broken into are found to be unlocked.




