NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH NOTES

I was very lucky when someone fraudulently used one of my credit card details. It is one that is used infrequently. I had bought time on a pay as you go phone.

When contacting the bank I was closely questioned to determine my identity. I was about to be sent the statement but the bank had recognised the fraud and cleared the account. Otherwise I had made some strange purchases.

I now have a new card.

I reported it to Action Fraud on "NFIBPhishing@city-of-london.pnn.police.uk". Phone number 0300 123 2040.

I have also heard of a man who had neither credit nor debit cards but received a thankyou letter from a shop's store card, and a statement. After explaining to the office he was advised to contact Experian, a credit rating business, to ensure that no other transactions had taken place under his name. On another matter I must remind you that if your dog worries sheep it could be shot by the farmer if seen in the act.

So do keep your dog on its lead, especially around fields where ground nesting birds may be brooding.

But, I'm told, if you are in a field with cattle, then, if they worry your dog you should let it off the lead.

I'm sure that you are also aware to respect and stay away from seals or any other sea mammals when boating or swimming. There is currently 'Operation Seabird' asking everyone to be aware of the sensitivities of the coastline and to take care.

But do enjoy your holiday and don't be a SCAM victim. The statistics are frightening. £50 million pounds lost. 20 thousand people victims.

As usual keep your things to yourself. Close windows if you're not in there, lock doors, people can knock or ring. Hide goods in your car. Not just at the car park.

Mrs Ann Bunning, head of Bridgerule Primary School, her staff and pupils, together with residents of the village gathered recently by the riverbank to watch Barbara Bowden, the eldest resident of Bridgerule and 92 years of age, plant a weeping willow tree to commemorate the forthcoming Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee. The Chairman of the Parish Council, Ken James, welcomed everyone on this special occasion.

Barbara nee Skinner was born at Winsford Halwill on October 29th 1929. Her family home was at Eastacombe Farm, Hollacombe with mum, dad, four brothers and a sister. Barbara began attending Holsworthy Primary School and later the Senior School. When it was time for Barbara to leave school, she began working on the family farm where life was busy and needed Barbara's help. Barbara recalls helping her brother, Bill, milk the cows by hand and the farm kept lots of poultry which would be sold later at Christmastime. A job that she did not enjoy at this time of the year was to help pluck all the turkeys, chicken, ducks and geese which would take the family about a whole week to do.

No mains water then, no mains electricity either. Oil and tilly lamps would provide light during the evenings at Eastacombe. Barbara remembers the first time she heard the wireless. It was a Sunday Service coming from St. Martins in the Field, London and everyone thought this was wonderful.

Not many families had televisions in those days but Barbara remembers going to a friend's house, which was packed full, to watch the 1953 Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in black and white.

Not too much socialising took place those days for Barbara but said that she attended Sunday School, some dances and Christmas parties.

Holsworthy Fair was a favourite, where she met her friends and enjoyed riding on the dodgems. Barbara said she had a bicycle and recalled riding it from her home to Halwill to meet friends. Barbara's family were involved in playing in Holsworthy Brass Band and it was at a concert that she met her husband to be, the late John Bowden.

In 1953 at Hollacombe Church and officiated by the late Rev. Father Kingdom, who was once vicar of Bridgerule, John and Barbara were married. The late Bill Vinnicombe was the best man.



Eastacombe was the venue for the wedding reception and so dad bought a generator. The honeymoon began at Newton Abbott where the couple travelled to London for 3 weeks.

The first few years John and Barbara lived at St Bridget's before moving into Churchtown Farm. There, Barbara took in paying guests and made lots of friends, some of whom still keep in contact with her. John and Barbara enjoyed lots of holidays, travelling to places such as Florida, France, Belgium, Scotland, Wales and Ireland.

In 1994 John retired from the farm and Barbara and John moved to St Katherine's, next to St Bridget's and this is where Barbara lives today. She says she is very blessed to have 2 sons, Trevor and Paul and their families. Trevor living nearby and Paul and his family living in Holsworthy.

Everyday when the family bring Barbara her milk supply she makes her own cream! Barbara regularly attends St Bridget's church services and enjoys being a member of Bridgerule Coffee Club.

How many of us can say we live in a home built around 1536! Barbara can! Hugh Stukelygh, whose family owned The Hartland Abbey, donated a piece of land by our parish church to be built on and used as a church house. Originally it was one house and later used as a school. Years later this house was then converted into to two homes; St Bridget's and St Katherines. Barbara having lived in both! The Editor thanks Barbara for some of her memories.

Google Chrome Hit by Another 2022 Zero-Day Hack

Google recently issued an urgent upgrade warning to its billions of Chrome users around the world.

A new zero-day high threat level hack has been found in Google Chrome Google issued the warning that Chrome on Windows, macOS and Linux are vulnerable to a new 'zero-day' hack (CVE-2022-1096).

Zero-day is a dangerous form of attack because it means the vulnerability is known to hackers before Google could issue a fix.

In late March, Microsoft confirmed that the same zero-day hack affects its Edge browser. The company published a new update confirming the exploit impacts all Chromium-based browsers: "which is used in Microsoft Edge." It also means Amazon Silk, Brave, Opera, Samsung Internet, Vivaldi and Yandex browser are all highly likely to have been affected.

Microsoft confirms it has released a fix for Edge as have Google for Chrome. To get it, follow these steps:

In your Microsoft Edge browser, click on the 3 dots (...) on the top right-hand

side of the window, click on 'Help and Feedback' click 'About Microsoft Edge'

Microsoft states that the patched version of Edge is 99.0.1150.553, so if your browser is showing a



lower number then you're still vulnerable and should be updated, the current version is 100.01185.

Chrome is now among the most targeted software in the world and Google acknowledges the number of zero-day attacks are rising, That said, the security protocols have never been better, although they do rely on users to keep their software up to date. Don't be the weak

link.

After updating, Chrome must be restarted before you are safe. To check your browser version, click on the 3 dots (...) on the top right-hand side of the Gloogle Chrome

Version 100 5 4506 50 (0% self bald) (64-bit)

Browser window, navigate to Help > About Google Chrome — this will also force Chrome to check for updates. Note: you are not protected until you restart the browser.

This is Chrome's second zero-day hack in 2022, take no chances, check your browser right now.


