



My name is Bridget Cordory and I have been

employed by TTVS <u>https://www.torridgecvs.org.uk/</u> and One Northern Devon <u>https://onenortherndevon.co.uk/</u> as the Community Developer for Holsworthy and surrounding parishes. I have worked in the community all my life in roles ranging from social work, special needs, community arts and establishing a community centre in Cambodia, more recently I was the Community Developer for Torrington.

Working with the Ruby Country Medical Group, Holsworthy Town Council, Parish Councils, Holsworthy Community Forum and other community groups, my aim is to work with local people to improve health and wellbeing by assisting to develop ideas that come from the community.

To enable this to happen I am collating and mapping the community activity provision that can provide early help and support to delay or prevent need for care interventions such as those that reduce social I solation, support carers, and those living with long term conditions in the community. #### Spotlight on someone born in Bridgerule

#### and now working for Formula 1!

#### JOANNE GARDENER

Joanne was born at Buttsbear Farm and is the youngest daughter of John and Sonia.

Joanne takes up her story:-

Apparently when asked what I wanted to be when I grew up, I responded with 'a daddy' – apparently, I meant my daddy and drive a lorry!

Over my years at Buttsbeer & Marhamchurch Primary, I sadly realised I didn't have quite the right 'skillset' to be that – on driving ability alone! However, there had been one common theme – sport.

In my younger years it was playing it, but as I came to terms that my talent wouldn't take me to professional stardom, I realised I might have to look into other ways to keep sport part of my life. After completing A-Levels at Shebbear, I went on to spend three years at Loughborough. You expect that on your graduation day you'll have a clear-cut idea of what life holds. Apart from student debt & a bunch of lifelong friends, it was fair to say, I had no clue. All I knew was that I was not cut out to be a PE teacher!

Formula 1 had never been more than a Sunday afternoon mention in the television guide growing up. However, having spent two years postgraduation working in Sports Recruitment, I was looking to move into Events Management. I'd always had an interest in the area, and my natural skillset seemed to lend itself to events, but my experience was limited to a couple of weeks working with BP at London 2012.

I used the contacts I had picked up in recruitment and sent a CV out to various sports teams, venues and agencies. When a job working in Formula 1 came up, I thought it might be fun, a good way to build up the air miles at least, and sent across a CV.

Two interviews, some frantic googling of the Drivers' names and a good portion of 'right place, right time' later, I was starting my new career in corporate hospitality on behalf of Shell.

Five years and 100+ flights later, I've worked with a number of sponsors in F1 and football, and lost count of the number of events & projects!

I've worked more broadly in sponsorship management and been part of some varied projects – everything from filming the latest FIFA18 player tricks with Paris Saint Germain, to helping Lewis Hamilton get his own back on some Sky Sports Presenters. I now find myself managing the team I joined five years ago, taking the lead on the Ferrari F1 programme for Shell.



In short, my job is to ensure guests (this can be anybody from the CEO to a forecourt attendant) have an unforgettable experience at a F1 race weekend. Pre-event we manage the tickets, hotels, transport, branding etc. and on-site it can be anything from hosting driver question and answers, explaining more about Shell's role as fuel supplier to Scuderia Ferrari, or simply being the one to ask the driver or celebrity for a photo when the guests go shy – it happens to everybody!! I can be responsible for anything from four to 800 guests. F1 is demanding, there's no 9-5, numerous 3am airport alarms, eye watering jet lag and there will always be guests who want more. But it's rewarding and addictive. The team you are working with at 1am become some of your closest friends. The 3am alarms are for travel to amazing cities such as Melbourne, Singapore & Monaco. The beaming smile on a guest's face after they've chatted to Sebastian Vettel washes away the stress that you went through when he, or she, realised they left their ticket in the hotel!

Each track & race weekend holds a different experience, and hurdles! Not all of my guests are F1 fans and it's part of my job to find the part of the sport they'll find interesting. Whether it's the racing, engineering, scale of budgets, travel or celebrity gossip, there's usually something I can get them talking on!

In China & Japan the challenge is language. Personally, I'm 99% certain I've eaten meats which I wouldn't have chosen to order if I could have read the menu, but it also throws up challenges on a work front. One year I had a group of Japanese guests in China so I was destined to fail, especially when the translator for the group asked me what time the 'match' started. Three days of smiling, hand gestures, photo taking and texting meeting times (luckily numbers are globally recognised!)

later, they were safely waved goodbye at the airport. Despite the minimal communication, they must have had a good time as the same group returned to Monza for the Italian GP. Although they insisted on bringing their own lunch of noodles to VIP hospitality – if any of you have Italian friends or family you will know this was not kindly received by Ferrari!

In Singapore, it's heat. The teams and drivers actually stay on European time because the race is run at night when it's cooler. Emphasis on the 'er' – 30-35° rather than 40°! However, guest programmes usually run on Singapore time and so I end up covering both time zones, whilst trying to acclimatise myself to the heat and 90% humidity. Shell may fuel the car, but Coca-Cola and energy drinks fuel the event team that week! That being said, watching the F1 cars thunder around the narrow city streets of Singapore is a sight not to be missed and we somehow end up looking forward to returning there each time September rolls around.

Guests always ask if it's 'normal' to me now. In one way, yes, but I still have to pinch myself when I'm in the garage or celebrating a Ferrari win at the podium (sorry Lewis fans). The atmosphere after a race win is indescribable – it's impossible not to become a fan of the sport when you see the passion & hard work behind it all. There are some elaborate celebration parties too, of course!

There's a saying that if you do more than five seasons in F1, you're in for life. It's been a rocky road at the start of my 6<sup>th</sup> but I am hopeful it won't be long until we're back trackside and the deafening roar of the F1 engines are interrupting my guest speeches once again!

The Editor thanks Joanne most sincerely for agreeing to report so readily on her exciting career. Note she says Seb's podium champagne. Actually this is Sebastian Vettel no less! No wonder she has to pinch herself.





# Windows 10 2004 Upgrade



It's that time of year when Microsoft releases an update or new version of Windows. This year, a major update of Windows 10 (version 2004, April 2020) was released in phased downloads on May 28<sup>th</sup> and will have hit your computer sometime in June for some and in the future for others!

I am writing this article on June 1<sup>st</sup> after installing and making good at least 4 computer installations affected by the new upgrade.

It shouldn't, but if does have an adverse effect on some 3<sup>rd</sup> party software, therefore some readers of this column will have already experienced issues with their systems. In the first instance Windows 10 needs approx. 8GB of free space to download and install. Those with large amounts of 3<sup>rd</sup> party applications installed on their system will need much more, one machine required over 50GB of free space to complete the process. If running a system with only 32GB storage this upgrade may well by-pass you.

The next issue is that the installation will take a minimum of 2 hours to complete fully, but you may experience a black screen whilst the programme further installs additional support software and this can run for a further 2 hours. Those using Office 365 will find the "Teams" app dumped on their system without warning.

Plus, it's Microsoft's intention to discontinue support of 32bit software and subject to your machines hardware (older machines operated on 32 bit

software), it may malfunction without warning, this may mean you have to forgo installing all future patches and fixes, or at least until you invest in a 64bit machine!!

So, as we come out of "Lock Down" you may be experiencing LOCK UP! and all the frustrations that brings. Hopefully most users will not feel a thing and the upgrade will go seamlessly from version 1909 to 2004.



However, computers using Windows 10 version 1903 or earlier will not upgrade automatically and a manual upgrade will be necessary.


