A CAUTIONARY TALE by Liz Dunkin

If you think your recycle is safe when you leave it outside your property for collection, think again. The responsibility actually passes to the driver on collection but if a package is found with your name and address on they come to you not the recycle people.

We have recycled for the last five years with no problems but recently I received a letter from Torridge District Council with the heading 'Offence: Depositing litter under Section 87/88 Environmental Protection Act 1990'. This letter requested I attend an interview under caution where the evidence would be shown to me. An offence under this Act, if found guilty, can lead to a fine of up to £2,500.

Apparently a package was found with my name and address on in a layby near Holsworthy Beacon. It was also found on the day our recycle was collected. This is a place I haven't been to or passed for at least 3 years. We wrote back to the council that day explaining that I hadn't done this and offered them my car GPS and phone GPS to check (which they didn't bother to do). This would have proved I was elsewhere. We also pointed out that we weren't stupid enough to dump a parcel anywhere with my name and address on it.

I had to employ legal representation to come with me as the interview was under caution. It wasn't a pleasant experience and I feel that it could have been avoided if they had done some research into the type of lorry that collected our recycle that day. They didn't even check the fact that the recycle lorry uses this particular route to return to Bideford, which was a fact we ascertained by phoning the recycle department. I feel this could all have been avoided after our explanation and a little common sense prevailing instead of causing stress and expense on my part.

What made me even more cross was the waste of our Council Tax money to deal with this in such a manner instead of just writing and asking for an explanation.

So after this experience I want to advise everyone to make sure your name and address is not on any packaging that goes to recycle or you could end up with an interview under caution too.

Insecure Wifi's in Bridgerule

Most broadband suppliers provide a router or hub which has a password set in to the flash memory, this password must be used by your computer, tablet, Ipad or phone before it can access the internet. It makes your internet connection secure, blocking access to the internet from criminals trying to use your data allowance, or more seriously blocks access to your computer and stops a thief from stealing your personal data.

A recent survey found some homes in Bridgerule are using insecure, open wifi connections which can allow thieves access their broadband and ultimately access to the personal data on their computer.

To test how secure your wifi is, open settings on a mobile phone and check wifi, you'll see a number of routers listed either secured with wpa/wpa2 or with OPEN written underneath the router name. You may also find a Printer wifi and the model number, which should also have the same secure message. If it doesn't and it displays OPEN, a backdoor to your computer exists and a cyber-criminal can access your computer and possibly steal your data.

The list displayed does not identify the home only the router and wifi, but if it's your router or printer, you should set up password protection either on the router or printer. Having a password to stop someone using your computer, tablet, Ipad, mac or phone will **NOT** stop access to your system through an open router or printer, so beware.

Cyber Crime is on the increase, especially as more criminals learn how

to crack weak passwords and poor security. Don't ever think it could never happen to me. Some people have already learnt the hard way...and it can be a very costly lesson to learn!!

Holsworthy WW1 100 years -

To the Memory of the Fallen and the Future of the Living

Holsworthy Town Council is inviting other local community organisations to organise a series of events to commemorate, thank and remember all those individuals who were involved in World War One.

2018 marks 100 years since the end of WW1

One of the ambitious aims of the project is to turn Holsworthy into the "Poppy Town" of Devon, but we also want the surrounding parishes to be a part of these activities. We want poppies to be everywhere, whether they are knitted, ceramic, cardboard etcno display can be too small and houses, gardens, shops need a blaze of poppy red from now onwards!

Information about the planned activities and poppy making is available on the HTC website, as well as posters in shops. Updates are on the website and on the HTC Facebook page.

We want to remember all the people who were involved in WW1, who lived in Holsworthy and the surrounding area. A permanent WW1 Memorial Tree Trail will be planted in Stanhope Park with 39 trees to remember the 39 local service personnel who died during the war and the 40th tree, will represent all of those who survived and lived through this tough time.....this will take place in October.

Holsworthy Town Council will be holding an event in Stanhope Park on Saturday 29th September 2pm – 10pm, this is free admission, allowing everyone to come together and commemorate the last 100 years. There will be live music, stalls, food, poems, readings, local school input, WW1 tank, Help for Heroes vehicle, RBL lorry & lots more. Posters are appearing around the town and surrounding parishes, this is also on HTC website and Facebook page.

In addition, the local schools and local organisations will have their own events over the next few months, which will be advertised individually. Remembrance Sunday on 11th November 2018 will start as usual in Holsworthy Square, with a special agenda of activities for that very important day including the National Lighting of the Beacon which is to take place along the coast line of England. LAUNCH OF NADFAS CHURCH TRAIL, ST BRIDGET'S BRIDGERULE.

About 25 years ago NADFAS (National Association of Fine and Decorative Arts Society) decided to record the many, varied and often

ancient artefacts found within our historic churches nationwide. During and evolving from that process the idea of church trails began some 10-15 years ago. These trails encourage children (in the company of an adult) to discover the treasures to be found within each church. They introduce children to art, architecture, church furnishings and history by following a questionnaire around the church. These manageable and achievable church trails leave a legacy in churches, not only for children but for anyone visiting that church, to enjoy and learn, for many years to come. There are now approximately 200 trails nationwide. Although they were initially devised for churches, their scope and range has now widened and trails have been completed in a gurdwara and a synagogue and a sensory trail is being developed for people living with dementia. Pat and Alec Johnston decided to take on the challenge of devising a trail for their local church, St Bridget's, in Bridgerule. With considerable assistance from Canon Tim Newcombe (Dartmoor Fine and Decorative Arts Society and National NADFAS representative) 15 months from taking that decision the church trail was launched, on Thursday May 24th. Class 3 pupils from Bridgerule C of E (VC) Primary School, with class teacher Ms Emily Carpenter completed the first trail. Whilst most of the pupils are familiar with the building, having previously visited it with school or for personal events it is hoped, on this special occasion, that they returned to school with more in depth knowledge of their local Parish church.

Mr Colin Punter, Deputy Mayor of Holsworthy, very kindly attended the launch and Mother Elizabeth Burke gave the final blessing.

IT SEEMED LIKE A GOOD IDEA AT THE TIME.....

Pale Park Vineyard opened its doors for business on 11 August 2018, after five years of sweat, toil, some blood and only a little bit of planning. When we moved to the area in 2013, we had little idea about what we were going to do to fill our time, having retired from full-time work in 2011, but the idea of growing a few vines to keep ourselves occupied (and enjoying the fruits of our labours) sounded quite attractive.



British wine is growing in popularity, although most British vineyards tended to focus on white and sparkling wines. So for some reason we decided to plant vines that would produce a red grape. We chose a Rondo, which being a German variety is more used to the temperate climate of the UK than most Mediterranean vines.

We planted 3,000 vines in April 2014 over approximately three acres of south facing, sloping land, with the help of a company that had planted fruit farms throughout the UK. However, Pale Park was the first vineyard they had planted, so, being viticulture virgins, it was a question of the blind leading the blind and a few mistakes were made in laying out the vineyard, to which we have had to find sometimes ingenious solutions over the years.

Gradually the vineyard took shape, with rapid growth of both the vines and the amount of work it takes to keep them in order. The vineyard year starts in January, when we prune back the previous year's growth to form the basis for the current year's development, laying down branches for the new buds. It takes two of us five weeks or more over January and February to prune ready for the coming year's crop. After that it is a question of keeping the grass down between the rows, trying to control the slugs who seem to love the young shoots, removing the secondary bud growth from the stems of the vines and constantly trimming and managing the vine canopy so the grapes grow up within the support wires that run down each row.

In April 2017 there was a late air frost, which damaged a large number of the vines and we wondered if we would get a harvest at all that year. During spring and summer the work is pretty much constant and there always seems to be something new to do. And this was supposed to be retirement.

Our first harvest was in October 2017, when to our surprise the winemaker who had agreed to produce our wine harvested just over three tonnes of grapes from approximately 1,000 vines. Although all the vines had been planted at the same time, their rate of development has been different, depending on soil and weather conditions in various sections of the vineyard. As a rough guide one tonne of grapes produces a thousand bottles. The window in which harvesting can take place is pretty narrow and we were anxiously watching the weather in September, whilst constantly measuring the sugar content and acidity of the grapes to assess the best time for picking. After harvesting, the remaining vines are cleared of redundant growth and the vineyard is left looking bare in anticipation of winter.

Whilst the wine was being made off-site we thought it might be a good idea to try and sell the end product, not least to try and recover some of our investment in the project. So after taking a licensing course and passing the necessary exam, we applied for and obtained a personal licence and a premises licence that allows us to sell the wine as "off" sales. The plan is to sell via our web-site, www.paleparkvineyard.co.uk, but we are also able to sell to the public at the "cellar door".

Our first year's production is labelled "Pale Park Rondo 2017" and is a light

(11.5% ABV) fruity, summer red. We are hopeful that the glorious summer of 2018 will provide us with as good if not better grapes for this year's vintage.

We are immensely grateful for the support and encouragement of our friends, family and neighbours in helping us get this far, not least Adam Pike, George Dunkin and Phil Cholwill, who have helped guide us past many of the pitfalls of farming – especially for the uninitiated!
