The chain of survival

In the event of a cardiac arrest, defibrillation can help save lives, but to be effective, it should be delivered as part of the *chain of survival*. There are four stages to the chain of survival, and these should happen in order. When carried out quickly, they can drastically increase the likelihood of a person surviving a cardiac arrest. They are:

- 1. Early recognition and call for help. Dial 999 to alert the emergency services. The emergency services operator can stay on the line and advise on giving CPR and using an AED.
- Early CPR to create an artificial circulation. Chest compressions push blood around the heart and to vital organs like the brain. If a person is unwilling or unable to perform mouth-to-mouth resuscitation, he or she may still perform compression-only CPR.
- 3. Early defibrillation to attempt to restore a normal heart rhythm and hence blood and oxygen circulation around the body. Some people experiencing a cardiac arrest will have a 'non-shockable rhythm'. In this case, continuing CPR until the emergency services arrive is paramount.
- 4. 4.Early post-resuscitation care to stabilise the patient.

As you are all probably aware Bridgerule are the proud owners of a defibrillator and this is located outside the Village Hall.

Unfortunately, this piece of life saving equipment has been receiving the wrong attention and on more than one occasion its been interfered with and the cabinet door has been left open.

Can I stress that this piece of equipment saves lives and must be ready to use at any such time. Please could you take the time to talk to your children and explain the importance of this piece of life saving equipment.

If this problem carries on then there maybe a possibility that a keypad will be fitted to the cabinet which could add vital minutes to saving someone's life.

If it's a text message forward it to 7726.


Holsworthy Walk and Talk



Microsoft, a follow-on...

Six years ago, Microsoft released Windows 10 and made a promise it would be the last of the Windows Upgrades. That promise has been broken and we are expected to welcome Windows 11 due on release around this time.



I wrote a few weeks ago Windows 10 X is being designed to display a central menu link on the task bar with several flexible screen displays; well, they have and hey presto its Windows 11, (interestingly, it wouldn't work before as Windows 10, but will now it's called Windows 11) their

issues revolve around security, Microsoft want to increase encryption in their software and have brought into play a Trusted Platform Module (TPM) this is a security chip embedded in the motherboard of modern systems that provides a hardware-based tamper resistant environment.

This is great if you have a system built after 2017, sadly systems built before this time don't have it, so Windows 11 will not work on these computers. Now that isn't too much of a problem as Windows 10 will still run on your



old computer, or should I say until October 2025, when Microsoft will cease supporting Windows 10 and like Windows 7 it will become increasingly vulnerable to hackers! This deadline may be extended, but don't hold your breath!

Also, some technical boffins have already identified, Windows 11 cannot be installed on some more recent systems and with others the BIOS has to be re-configured and the TPM activated, Microsoft have written "we are working on it!"

So, as will be the case for millions of owners of older systems, a new computer may need to go on your Christmas list in the near future. That is unless you change the operating system to Chromium, Linux or similar, which will allow you to keep your old computer running and still access the internet, write letters and print documents.

It's a frightening thought, a mountain of computers being disposed of and a hackers dream of all the discarded hard drives that has personal & private information stored on them. At the time writing no decision has been made as to whether Windows 11 will be a free upgrade or a purchase, time will tell!

All banks are moving into double security tags, which means if you don't have a smart phone, you may not be able to access your money!
