At Last OFCOM is doing its job!

A new directive by Ofcom, published: 29th July has given phone companies 6 months to come up with plans to stop spoof calls.

These must include

- Block more calls from abroad which imitate UK landline numbers.
- More effort must be employed to reduce suspicious calls and texts.
- Prove the disruption of spoofing from abroad and mobile messaging scams.

People will be better protected against scammers who call from abroad and imitate UK landline numbers, under strengthened industry guidance.

This guidance will come into effect from 29 January 2025.

Hopefully this will now help reduce the number of scam calls hitting every home.

I've spoken at length on my reservations regarding AI and I know it will eventually benefit mankind in many ways. However, the short-term use is misguided and wrong! This is borne out by Microsoft who have suspended the publication of their AI voice simulator as being too dangerous for general use. This software which can not only clone an exact voice pattern and convert a text document into real time audio, although text to speech has been used for many years using simulated voices, the accuracy is now such that any voice when cloned and published with totally fake dialogue



and imagery will have devastating consequence! However other software companies continue to promote similar systems and this will only lead to many future scams.

The incarceration of Stop Oil protestors made me think of a recent study by Oxford University on the annual Green House Gas emissions of a computer. The study shows the carbon footprints of some typical working Personal Computers:


- Desktop + screen emits 621kg CO₂e
- Laptop + screen emits 691kg CO₂e (up 11%)
- Desktop + 2 screens emit 903kg CO₂e (up 45%)
- Laptop + screen at office + screen at home emits 928kg CO₂e (up 49%)
- Desktop + screen + laptop emits 1,030kg CO₂e (up 66%)

Over 95% of all computer components are made in China and most electronic systems are made with over 90% plastic components, the burning of fossil fuels is not the only contributor to global warming and the more we use computers and mobile phones the more CO_2 is pushed into the atmosphere, then there is the mining of cobalt to make the batteries using child labour in Africa and the highly toxic burning of components in India to retrieve small amounts of gold from old motherboards, I could go on!

Derril Water Solar Park Update



Following the completion of road works and site entrances, onsite work has started, including constructing access tracks. These tracks are being built at a rate of approximately 100 meters per day. The northwestern section of the site has been completed, and the southwestern section is expected to be finished by the third week of August. National Grid has also finished cabling works and backfilled their joint stations.

Temporary 'trackway' mats are being installed in fenced compound areas. String inverters are scheduled for delivery by the third week of August. The first batch of solar panels has already arrived on-site and is undergoing inspection and proper storage.



The mounting racks for the panels are due to start arriving in the coming weeks and mechanical and electrical work will start at the end of August.

It's going to be a busy couple of months with completing the track construction works, installing fencing, assembling panel racks, laying CCTV cables through trenches, delivering transformers and switchgears, and constructing the substation foundation. Additionally, panel deliveries to the site will continue.

Remember, Derril Water Solar Park is Ripple Energy's first exciting shared solar project in the UK. Members not only benefit from clean energy but actually own this project.

Neighbourhood Watch Notes

If you believe you should be eligible for the Winter Fuel Payment - now only for those on Pension Credit and other benefits, you are best consulting Citizens Advice Bureau. Or phone the pension credit claim line, if as a couple your weekly income is less than £332•95 (£218•15 if single). Other factors are brought in to the claim if you have savings or responsibilities for others. The claim phone number is 0800 99 1234. Pension credit can be backdated for up to three months.

There are several numbers for Citizens Advice Bureau. You can try 0808 223 1133, or 0808 278 7999, or 0800 144 8848, or 0344 411 1444.

Scams continue to be at the forefront of a lot of crime, be it the phone call saying your card has been used, or your Amazon subscription is due a refund, or anything else that asks you to press "one" to refute the statement. DON'T press anything - just put the phone down. It's lies.

Emails or text messages coming out of the blue putting pressure on you to deal with now. DON'T, just think, is this really what it says? Let action fraud know if you get one of these "www.actionfraud.police.uk" or phone 0300 123 2040. You can report suspicious text messages on 7726, and phishing emails on "report@phishing.gov.uk".

A popular scam is the fake TV licensing one. No one wants to be without their TV licence - especially as it is no longer free to most. Always check before replying to anything like that.

If you get a call from the Fraud Department, STOP, is it really? Unlikely. Again - put the phone down and use the number you know is correct. 159 for most banks will get you to their fraud department.

Meanwhile enjoy the latter end of the year, hoping for continuing good weather and enough rain for the gardens etc. But still keep your goods to yourself. Lock doors, windows and vehicles. Don't leave keys lying about or your GPS items on easy view.

Be aware of the Countryside Code and be careful with animals that are unlikely to want to be herded to your way of thinking.

Don't ring 999 because of the peculiar smell or loud noise. It is an Emergency number, not the local helpful neighbour. That neighbour may be able to solve your dilemma, that's part of Neighbourhood Watch.

70 YEARS AFTER SEWING HIS BRIDE IN HALF ON WEDDING DAY CELEBRATE PLATINUM ANNINVERSARY





Ray and Joan Palmer, who settled in Bridgerule last year, look forward to celebrating their 70th wedding anniversary on 11th September.

They both grew up in Wisbech, Cambridgeshire. Joan was a dancer in a local troupe, and Ray, with his lucrative conjuring hobby, was known by his middle name, as 'Ray DaSilva, the Fenland Magician'

They first met, not on a stage, but in the laboratory of a food factory where they both started work on the same day. Ray and Joan fell in love and were married in 1954 at the church of St Peter & St Paul, Wisbech. They had concocted a double act of magic which included the sawing-in-half illusion (sorry no photo) and decided to spend their honeymoon at a magicians' convention! The national press took up the story – see details in the news cuttings attached.

Ray says: "It's just as well I wasn't charged with murder!" and "Don't believe everything you read in newspapers." Ray and Joan became fulltime puppeteers in 1962 after returning from a few years in Canada. They set up a company in 1969 based at Godmanchester then, in the late 70's were responsible for the conversion of a redundant medieval church in Norwich to a 200-seat puppet theatre – which is still in operation .

They have moved house several times, gradually migrating westwards via Bicester and Gillingham, and now live at Tamar Cottage next door to their son Nik and Sarah at Tamar House Farm. At one of the Bridgerule Coffee Club outings Ray expressed how deeply they appreciated the nice welcome they had been given by the local community.

I am lonely

When we think this, our response is often to feel fear, embarrassment or discomfort and I ask myself why, especially given that nearly everyone feels lonely at some point in their lives.

I think in our society the word 'lonely' carries a stigma, a mark of disgrace or shame, which is ridiculous when you think about it. We appear to be able to show emotions such as anger, confusion, or stress, without getting the same response. So, why do we respond to the word 'lonely' in this peculiar fashion?

In part it's due to the language used around the emotion. We describe people as 'suffering' from loneliness instead of 'experiencing' it, or we say people are 'admitting' to loneliness rather than just 'telling' someone about it. Even the term 'I am lonely' is unhelpful – we may 'feel' lonely but it shouldn't define us, nor is it always a constant state of mind. I believe that controlling a situation is crucial to successfully handling it, so getting the language around loneliness correct should hopefully help us feel more in control. If not, why mention loneliness at all? Instead, we could say something like, 'I think I could do with a bit more going on in my life'.

Being alone is the physical state of being by yourself, whereas loneliness is an emotional state about the way we feel within ourselves. Accepting these facts can also help us feel more in control – remember, being physically alone can feel lovely and being in a group can feel lonely.

There are many reasons why we can sometimes 'feel' lonely. Maybe our circumstances change, like leaving school, work or home, our health changes or disability and age impact us. We may experience bereavement, discrimination, or have to deal with a family history. All these factors and more can affect our feelings. Given that the reasons are so broad and nearly all of us have probably experienced loneliness at some point in our lives, isn't it time we start to think about loneliness differently? Let's not see it as a feeling that separates us but as one that allows us to connect, an opportunity to unite in a shared experience and a trigger to start positive conversations about well-being.

Beyond language, we also need some practical solutions to **help ourselves** or **help others** manage loneliness

Here are some suggestions to help us or others connect: join something, message someone, read, write down your thoughts, volunteer, adopt a pet, go online (see positive sites at the end), learn new things (computer skills is always a good option for those not confident with IT), talk and listen, or visit our village shop (you can do this anyway, whether you feel lonely or not!). Actively connect with others and you will find people who you feel good around. If nothing else, flip through this Buzz magazine and look at the opportunities that this community offers for connecting; we are lucky to live here.

I am not saying you can replace a lost person or instantly change the circumstances that got you here, but you can change how you feel about it or how others feel about it. Try to take one step or help someone else take one step in the right direction. If initially that step doesn't work — be brave, take another. What works will be different for everyone. Good days and bad days are just part of life, but my thoughts would be to give yourself the skills, tools, and knowledge to increase the good ones.

The final question:

Am I lonely? No **Have I ever felt lonely**? Yes, of course I have




