The clocks have gone back and it's getting dark earlier. Now is as good a time as any to check all vehicle lights are working to help keep people safe. How many cars do you see out there with lights not working?



As you get home, draw the curtains and do lock up, you never know who's out there. Burglary or housebreaking or tools from the van, it's all the same to the crooks.

Don't worry, it never happens here - until it does! It does to someone somewhere every day - with luck not always the same person.

Most crimes are committed purely because of the opportunity offered, not thought out beforehand. So try not to give them the chance. Lock up. Keep things hidden from view - especially if you have just been Christmas shopping. You know it makes sense.

And now for something completely different.

Did you know you may qualify for a free home safety visit by the Devon and Somerset Fire Service? If you are living on your own or are elderly you can phone 0800 05 02 999 and talk to them. If eligible you will get a full review of your home safety with regards to fire, and a free smoke alarm. For rented properties all this is down to the landlord - smoke alarms on every floor; carbon monoxide alarm in rooms where solid fuel is used; gas appliances checked by registered Gas Safe engineers every year etc.

Belated 90th Birthday Greetings to Dennis Martyn

Dennis Martyn, who was 90 recently, moved to Borough Farm Bridgerule in 1947 at the age of 19, with his parents, Harold and Mabel. They had previously farmed at Scotland Farm on the other side of the Parish, which had been bought by his grandparents, John and Jane Martyn, after they'd sold their bakery at Week St Mary. The flour dust and heat were the cause of poor health for John and his doctor had advised a change of occupation. Borough had the

advantage of an electricity supply at that time which resulted in most of the oil lamps being discarded and thrown into a pit at Scotland. In fact electricity had come to Borough just before World War 2, but only because the poles were put up down the wrong road!

The move from horse power to tractors was made soon after the war ended but the family kept a strong interest in horses, with dad being a keen competitor at gymkhanas and riding to hounds with the Tetcott Hunt along with his dad Harold. Through the 1950s and 60s the farming at Borough Farm advanced rapidly and saw the early uptake of silage as a means to conserve winter fodder - no plastic sheeting was available to cover the clamp, just a layer of lime! Pedigree herds of large white pigs and British Friesian dairy cattle were established - boars being sold to eastern European counties to improve pig breeds there.

Dennis married Mildred and together they have two sons, Jonathon and Timothy. They also have 3 grandchildren; Erin, the first Martyn girl in the family for 162 years and her brothers, Fraser and Duncan. Dennis still enjoys the odd day out with the hounds still in the company of his friends and neighbours and 'chewing the fat', reminiscing about the huge changes he has witnessed from the Shire horses to the modern tractors now seen. If you are local and want to know your family tree he'll likely to have it all in his head for you.



ALL THE WAY FROM SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA TO WALK IN THE STEPS OF BRIDGERULE'S SPECIAL LADY.

A few months ago Sheila and Rose had an email from Jacky who lives in Sydney Australia of her desire to come and walk in the steps that Elizabeth McArthur would have. taken many years ago in the village of Bridgerule, where she was born in 1766. Elizabeth Macarthur and John, her husband, played an integral part in establishing Australia's wool industry and she has been referred to as Australia's first and greatest lady!

The day after Jacky and her husband Mark arrived Rose and Sheila took them to Lodgeworthy Farm, the birthplace of Elizabeth and today's owners Vivienne and David Hale. Here a delicious cream tea was enjoyed. The following day we visited The Glebe. This was where Elizabeth Macarthur spent many hours with Rev. Kingdom and his family, who were then the residents of what was the vicarage.

The top photo shows Jacky and husband Mark 2nd and 3rd from left together with the now owners of The Glebe, The Brewer Family and below it as The Glebe could have looked in Elizabeth's time. The bottom photo is the long house at Lodgworthy where Elizabeth was born.

It is felt that this very important lady's life should be remembered in our village, by holding a special event next year and it is a wish for pupils of our local school to learn of her in their studies. The bells of St. Bridget's Church Bridgerule will be rung at 7.05 p.m.as part of Battle's Over, an international commemoration marking 100 years since the guns fell silent at the end of World War I.

Organised by Pageantmaster Bruno Peek LVO OBE OPR, Battle's Over takes place on **November 11th 2018**, with events throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, and at scores of locations overseas, including New Zealand, Ireland, Australia, Bermuda, France, Belgium, Canada, the United States and Germany, to name but a few.

It begins at 6am with **lone pipers** playing Battle's O'er, a traditional Scottish air played after a battle, outside cathedrals in the country, following which a specially written tribute will be read out. At the same time, over 1,000 pipers will be playing the tune in individual locations within their local communities.

At 6.55pm buglers will sound the **Last Post** at more than 1,000 locations, where at 7pm beacons will be lit in a tribute called **Beacons of Light**, signifying the light of peace that emerged from the darkness of four years of war.

Then at 7.05pm over 1,000 church and cathedrals will ring their bells as part of **Ringing Out for Peace** organised in association with the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, which represents 65 societies of ringers from the British Isles and overseas. Also at 7.05, more than 140 town criers will perform a specially written **Cry for Peace Around the World**, the first of them in New Zealand and then across the globe through the various time zones.




