### Six decades of cel ebrations!

In honour of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, St Bridget's Church held an exhibition of weddings dresses and christening robes used in St Bridget's over the six decades of the Queen's reign. Along with the brides and their families, and visitors from the village, the church also welcomed visitors from across the South West and even one visitor from New Zealand! Thank you to everyone who supported the event.

The dresses were arranged in chronological order along with mementoes such as invitations and some interesting facts about the other things that happened during that year. Everyone particularly enjoyed looking at photographs alongside the dresses and picking out how people and fashions had changed over the years!

Below are details of the dresses included and some of the factoids that went with them:

- Miss Audrey May Gilbert married Mr Ronald Francis Crocker on 28<sup>th</sup> September 1957. They were married by Rev F. Kingdon. They had five bridesmaids and the weather was fine. The average house price in 1957 was £2,330 with the average Wage £600. Bread cost 4d and a pint of beer 2d.
- Miss Margaret Ann Andrew married Mr William Francis Eastcott on 4<sup>th</sup> April 1964. They were married by Rev Piggott. They had three bridesmaids and a pageboy. The weather was cold and drizzly. The average house price in 1964 was £3,360. Government figures show that the average weekly wage was £16. On the 10th March The Queen gave birth to her fourth child, a son, Edward.
- Miss Clarice Elizabeth Cholwill married Mr Peter John Harris on 6<sup>th</sup> October 1973. They were married by Rev P. Swaffield. They had four bridesmaids. The weather was showery but not cold. The average house price in 1973 was £9,942. The average wage for men was £40.90 a week. A pint of Theakston's Best Bitter was 13p and a pint of milk was 55p. In 1973 the average price of a small car was £1,000 and petrol at a BP service station cost 36p a gallon. On 14<sup>th</sup> November 1973, Princess Anne married a commoner, Captain Mark Phillips, in Westminster Abbey (they later divorced in 1992)
- Miss Karen Jane Brock married Mr David John Gliddon on 24<sup>th</sup> July 1982. They were married by Rev P. Morgan. They had two bridesmaids and a pageboy. The weather was sunny. The average house price in 1982 was £23,644 and a gallon of petrol cost £1.59. On 1st January 1982 ITV launched three regional TV stations Central, TV South and TV South West.

- Miss Janet May Crocker married Mr John Henry Hallett on 8<sup>th</sup> June 1985. They were married by Rev P. Morgan. They had four bridesmaids and the weather was dull but dry. The average house price by then was £40,169 and a gallon of petrol cost £1.88. On 19<sup>th</sup> February 1985, EastEnders, the BBC1 soap opera, showed on the channel for the first time. On 3rd March 1985 the miners' strike ended after one year.
- Miss Melanie Jayne Gander married Mr Paul Thomas Dymond on 31<sup>st</sup> August 1991. They were married by Rev P. Morgan and Rev R. Burrow. They had three bridesmaids. The weather was hot and sunny. The average house price was £70,987 and a gallon of Petrol cost £2.05. On 19th October 1991 Canadian singer Bryan Adams made history when his hit single (Everything I Do) I Do It for You, which featured in the film Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves entered its 15th successive week at number one in the UK singles charts.
- Miss Katherine Ann Louise James married Mr Kelvin Spencer Davey on 7<sup>th</sup> September 1996. They were married by Rev L Brookhouse. They had four bridesmaids. The weather was fine and sunny. The average house price in 1996 was £69,453 and gallon of petrol cost £2.70. On 13th February 1996 Take That, the most successful British band so far this decade, announced that they were splitting up.
- Miss Natasha Louise Hambley married Mr Darren John Stephens on 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2000. They were married by Rev L. Brookhouse. They had three bridesmaids and their son Josh as pageboy. The weather was fine and sunny, but windy. The average house price by 2000 had reached over the hundred thousand mark at £101,5004. In August of that year Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother celebrated her 100th birthday.

Miss Lisa Jeffery married Mr Barry John Lucas on 16<sup>th</sup> September 2005. They were married by Canon L. Ryder. They had three bridesmaids. The weather was fine. Also shown with this coat was a christening robe made out of Lisa's wedding dress. This was used at the baptisms of the couple's two children, William and Phoebe. By 2005 petrol prices had reached £3.49 per gallon. On 9th April - The wedding of Charles, Prince of Wales and Camilla Parker Bowles took place in a 20-minute ceremony at Windsor Guildhall, followed by a blessing at St George's Chapel in Windsor Castle. On 23rd June Prince Charles of Wales graduated from the University of St Andrews.

### **Christening Robes**

Four christening robes were shown, along with the Lucas robe. They had been loaned by the Bowden, Harris, Short and Crocker families, although used for generations. As they had been passed along the female lines of the family, some of them had changed names several times. We all marvelled at the work that had gone in to making the robes and how

well they had been kept over the years.

### **Prouse Christening Robe**

This christening robe was used by the Prouse family (George, Jack and Elsie) at the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. It was then used by the Jones family from 1934, then by the Vinnicombe family for Margaret and Phillip. The robe was used most recently for the Short family; Darryn, Gareth and Janine.

### **Crocker Christening Robe**

This christening robe was first used by the Crocker family in 1958 for Michael, then subsequently for Janet. It has more recently been used for the baptisms of Mark and Paul Crocker and Simon and Jamie Hallett.

### **Saltern Christening Robe**

This christening robe was hand made by Fanny Saltern wife of William Saltern in 1899.

Lily Louisa (Bowden) was the first member of her family to wear the robe; followed by siblings Flossie (Sangwin), Jack & Frank. John Bowden wore the robe for his christening at St. Bridget's Church in 1927. In more recent years it has been worn by Trevor & Paul Bowden.

The next generation to wear the robe were Robert Bowden in 1986, Katy Bowden in 1989 and Willow Bowden in 2001.

### **Bowden Christening Robe**

This Christening robe was made for Mr and Mrs William Bowden and was first used by John Bowden in 1885 and then his five siblings. It was then used by the Vinnicombe and Bassett families in the early 1900s. In the 1950's and 60's it was used by 8 members of the next generation including Robert Honey and Clarice Cholwill. More recently in the 1970's and 80's it was used for some of their children including Valerie

and Michael Harris and Rosalind Honey.

The P.C.C would like to offer their sincere thanks to the brides for their support in putting the exhibition together. Thanks also go to the parents who leant their christening robes and to all of the members of the church congregation who donated refreshments and helped to serve them. Thank you also to all of those involved in putting together the display, producing photos, loaning mannequins and generally making the event a success. Around £200 was raised for church funds with a further £188 going to the Air Ambulance as part of the Open Gardens event.

Enthusiastic gardeners had cut, mowed, weeded and tidied up their gardens for this very special annual event which is now firmly part of Bridgerule's yearly activities. They had a tremendous response and managed to raise £1,826. A cheque for £913 will be sent to each Trust.

Local people as well as holidaymakers were once again extremely generous in support of these 2 very worthwhile charities. For the entrance fee of £3.50 visitors could visit all 7 gardens, the Church exhibition and the Chapel. John and Cathy Nettles kindly opened their very large garden with ponds and lakes, specimen trees and a few rescued animals. Visitors were happy to buy bags of fish food which enabled them to view the fish jumping in the lake. The fish food sold like hot cakes! There was also an older style "wildlife friendly" cottage garden with an orchard and hens roaming freely where you could buy delicious lunches and rest awhile with a cuppa. One new garden was involved this year, a compact easily maintained garden which also sold toiletries. Once again John Hammond had his magnificent display of old garden tools, and another garden had 4 happy ex-battery hens proudly wearing a new set of feathers while just next door there was a garden with plenty of seating showing that gardening can be relaxing. In fact there was something for everyone to enjoy.

Once again ladies of St Bridget's Church made and served the cream teas and other refreshments. The local Methodist Chapel ladies sold home made cakes at their cake stall, which was once again well visited by the visitors. A raffle was also held which was generously supported by local businesses who donated some lovely prizes including a round of golf for four people, holistic massage, Sunday lunches, hanging baskets, many bottles of wine, gift vouchers for cream teas and petrol vouchers.

### **Special Invitation to attend Exeter Cathedral:**

Several weeks ago the Parish Council were requested to nominate someone from their community to attend a future celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in recognition of 'local unsung heroes' (local, but not sure if I fit the rest). Cliff nominated myself and some weeks later an invitation came through the door from the Dean and Chapter of Exeter Cathedral and HM Lord Lieutenant of Devon inviting me and a guest to attend a Special Service to celebrate The Diamond Jubilee of her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on Sunday 27th May and prior to the service attend a Garden Party at Bishop's Palace. The day arrived and in true garden party style the weather was wonderful the day before but today the heavens had opened!

Nevertheless my guest, Col and I dressed in our Sunday best made our way to Exeter Cathedral and as luck or something would have it as soon as we reached our destination the sun came out. Within minutes I met up with someone I had gone to school with many years ago and we stayed together for the duration of the day catching up when at all possible.

The four of us made our way to Bishop's Palace for the Tea Party. Some of the guests proudly wearing their medals and many ladies wearing outfits fit for Ladies day at Ascot or a Buckingham Palace Garden Party.

We then made our way to the Cathedral and were ushered to our seats in the left nave and fortunately for us just behind the dignitaries in the centre of magnificent cathedral seating on this day about 1000.

The 'unsung heroes' were given a special mention in the opening speech by the Dean of the Cathedral and just before 4.00pm the organist began to play Handel's - 'The Music for the Royal Fireworks' and Elgar's - 'Pomp and Circumstance Military March No.1.' It was so grand that for the next few moments it made me think of how the music would have sounded at Prince William and Katherine's wedding at Westminster Abbey. It was truly wonderful.

We were each given a special commemorative Order of Service which had been divided into six decades with the cathedral choir performing several anthems and a special Devon County Children's Choir also chosen to sing. During these anthems large television screens had been placed around the cathedral showing important events that had occurred in the world over the last sixty years. Just before the close of the service a 'Big Book of Thanks' containing goodwill messages of the people of Devon was received by Bishop Michael and given to the Lord-Lieutenant to pass on to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth.

Colin and I said our goodbyes to our friends and made our way home. Later, we recalled our special visit to Exeter Cathedral.

THE VILLAGE SHOP AND ADJOINING COTTAGES

As many of the community will already know, Jubilee Terrace was sold at the beginning of May. Since the purchase by two local investors, various rumours have circulated regarding the fate of The Terrace and village shop. We can now confirm that it is the owner's intention to renovate The Terrace and re-create the original cottages Albert, Jubilee and Victoria House. On the approval of planning the village shop will also be extended to provide a bright, spacious and modern village store. Works have already commenced and it is anticipated the project will be concluded by late spring next year.

The owners hope that with the cooperation of Dawn and Tony, the shop and post office will stay open while the proposed renovations take place. ### MODEL OF CONTAINER CRANE



A lot of container ships are now capable of carrying over 5000 containers. These ships need special terminals in the ports and large fast moving cranes to unload them. Large ports will have banks of six of these cranes alongside the terminal and they can offload as many as 25 ships a week - up to 125000 containers.

### The prototypes.

These large cranes stand over 110 metres high when the boom is raised to allow for easy berthing of ships and 125 metres long when the boom is in the horizontal working position.

### Michael's Model

The height of the crane built out of meccano by Michael Moore (above) is 2.4 metres. Length is 2.7 metres when the boom is in the horizontal working position. It took Michael 231 hours to build and used 2739 parts and 6527 nuts and bolts.

It also takes 7 power drive units to take care of all the movements.





### **COOKERY COMPETITIONS**

**3 PLAIN SCONES on a plate** 

Recipe as follows: makes 8

8 oz SR Flour 3 ozs Butter at room temperature. 1½ oz castor sugar, 1 large egg, 4-8 tbsp milk.

Preheat over to 200C (200C Fan oven) Sift flour and pinch of salt. Add butter and rub in until it resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar. Mix in egg and gradually add milk until dough binds together but not sticky. Flour work surface and roll out dough to 1 inch thick. Cut 8 scones with 2inch cutter. Lightly brush scones with milk. Bake at top of oven for 10—12 minutes until golden.
