

battered and broken with death in the air



Daniel has always lived in our village and began his fulltime education at Bridgerule Primary School in 1995 under the headship of Mrs. Sutton. At the age of 9 Daniel showed an interest in engineering when he and Rafe Chard, a pupil also at Bridgerule entered a Junior Knex competition for Junior engineers and their success saw them travel to Plymouth to collect their certificates. It was also during his primary education that Daniel began to play the baritone for Bude Town Band, taking part in various concerts and competitions.

At the age of eleven Daniel continued his education at Holsworthy Community College and where he later took his GSCE examinations.



Daniel also enjoyed Rugby and played hooker from the age of thirteen until he entered university for Bude Rugby Football Club. During this time he gained a trophy for most improved player.

Very sadly in June 2005, as the result of a road accident Daniel at the age of 14 felt the tragic loss of his sister, Tracey. To further his education Daniel chose then to study for his 'A' levels. This he did at Budehaven Community College and received good results, which gained him an entrance into the University of the West of England at Bristol to study Motor Sport Engineering for 3 years.

For one of these years Daniel was required to have a work placement. For this Daniel applied to the famous Red Bull Racing Team alongside 800 other applications! Daniel was invited for an interview when the final 50 applicants had been chosen and he was even shortlisted to the final four but was not successful in securing the placement. Whilst at university Daniel worked for Generation Aston Martin Racing as part of the pit crew. During his time with the team he worked at several race meetings at Silverstone Circuit. When Daniel wasn't studying and when he came home on breaks he enjoyed and still continues to build the cars and compete in driving in banger racing, travelling as far as Portsmouth in Hampshire and to St. Day in Cornwall.

In June 2012 Daniel gained a Bachelor of Engineering Degree and he and his proud parents travelled to Bristol Cathedral in July for the graduation service.

Whilst actively looking for employment since his graduation Daniel is at present

working on a dairy farm near Highampton.

Daniel is the only son of Gary and Shirley Abbott of Carn Venn.






BRIDGERULE VILLAGE COFFEE MORNINGS

Would you like to come carol singing?

Anybody who would like to come CAROL SINGING in the village on Wednesday 12th and the following Wednesday 19st December is most welcome.



We meet on the 12^{th} at the Christmas tree in the centre of the village (opposite Bridge Inn) and on 19^{th} at the lamp post/bus stop near Littlebridge Cross. Both times we meet at 6.30 pm

Wednesday 12th is the one that makes you feel that Christmas has arrived. We'd like adults to come along and accompany the children from Bridgerule Primary School, and when they sing "Away in a manger" you can't help having a lump in your throat – it's just so lovely! We usually go back to the school for a hot drink (although this hasn't been decided yet this year) before dispersing, and we finish about 8.30.pm

On the 19th we usually have quite a few adults, but children are most welcome accompanied by an adult. We sing around Littlebridge and Southfields area and try and do the centre of the village. Again we finish about 8.30pm and it is not unknown that some of us go the Bridge Inn afterwards to "wet our whistle".

Collections are made from the houses using tins, whilst some of us sing in a group under a nearby lamppost – layers of warm clothing and the carrying of torches are recommended. Last year we collected nearly £100 from the kind, generous people of Bridgerule, and all the money is divided equally between the Church, the Chapel and the School.

Spotlight on Mr. Ben Ashton

Mr. Ben Ashton was born on December 21st 1915 at Darracott Kilkhampton with part of the then family farm now forming part of Tamar Lakes.

Ben attended Kilkhampton Primary School and at the age of eleven he began attending Dunheved College now called Launceston College.

Upon reaching the age of 14 after taking his final exams he began working on the family farm at Darracott. In 1937 Mr. Ashton Senior sold Darracott and the family moved to rented accommodation at Forda Kilkhampton.



Southlands Farm Bridgerule was where Ben together with his mum, dad and sister Marion then moved to. Renting the farm at first and later buying it from the Kingdom family.

When war broke out Ben joined the Home Guard. He remembers that one night in every nine dressed in uniform and armed with a rifle he and other members of the Home Guard would go to Highfield. Their shift was from 9.00pm to 6.00am and their job was to patrol the roads at Bridgerule in case of enemy attack.

He also joined the Holsworthy Signallers and part of his training in the Signallers was to learn the Morse Code. During the war about six acres of potatoes were grown at Southlands alongside other vegetables and the Italian and German prisoners of war who were being held in a camp in Holsworthy were transported by coach to Southlands and other local farms to assist in the husbandry of the land. An officer would be sent with these men and Ben remembers them helping to dig the potatoes on his father's farm and also the clearing of some woods.

Ben also recalled when the workmen would use the heavy horses on his dad's farm to carry out specific tasks at Southlands.

Ben recalls that the first tractor he bought was a new Fordson costing £185 and said that Southlands was the first farm in Bridgerule to have a tractor with rubber tyres. Ben has always been interested in cars and remembered that the first car his father had was a new Morris Oxford bought in 1924 at a cost of £300 from Messrs. Cann Medlands Garage in Bude, now the Esso Garage.

A major part of Bens farming life was to buy and sell good stock and that interest is still there today. When he began farming in 1938 he recalls paying about £15 per head for good store cattle and £18/£20 for a cow and calf.

Ben liked to travel to dances and it was at one such dance after an Annual Launceston Horse Show that he met a Miss Barbara Ward from Lifton and in 1945 at Lifton Parish Church she became his wife.

The honeymoon being spent in Bournmouth and on their return they began married life living at Southlands with Ben's parents.

In 1946 their only daughter, Celia was born. Celia lives with her husband Victor at Stitworthy Farm Clovelly.

In about 1952 Ben contracted polio and had to spend three weeks in an Isolation Hospital in Plymouth. Visitors going to see him could only speak to him through a glass screen.

Ben remembers the family selling their own produce of butter, poultry, rabbits and apples regularly at a market near to the Neetside in Bude. He also recalls pigs at Southlands years ago contracting Swine Fever and all of the carcasses having to be buried at least six foot deep and covered in lime.

In 1955 Mr. and Mrs Ashton Senior built a bungalow very near to Southlands and retired to 'The Gables' Bridgerule. The late Mr. Wilfred Westlake was employed by Ben for many years as a farm worker and even after Ben's retirement he continued to work for Bens son-in-law at Stitworthy.

Ben semi-retired in 1976 and both Barbara and Ben have enjoyed going on holidays. One of the favorites' was in 1981 when they travelled to Australia, Hong Kong and Thailand for six to seven weeks.

In 1991 Mr and Mrs. Ashton passed their stone farm buildings on to their daughter, Celia. These buildings were then converted and in 1992 Southlands Court Residential Home was officially opened. One of its employees since the official opening has been Winnie, wife of the late Wilfred Westlake who had been employed by Ben when Southlands was a farm.

Ben has been a member of Holsworthy Bowling Club and in addition to playing local matches he enjoyed spending a week away during the summer playing clubs further a field

At the age of 96 Ben still drives his car and regularly attends the local Methodist Chapel. He was for many years a Treasurer of the chapel. He enjoys watching television especially sport and in particular football, tennis and cricket. His favourite football team being Manchester United. He also enjoys political programmes on television and reads the daily newspaper. Ben also takes great

pride in his garden which is full of mature shrubs and plants which when the editor visited was absolutely lovely.

Ben and Barbara have been married for 66 years and have two grandchildren, Robert and Claire and three great grand children, Nathan, Melissa and Caitlin.



I sincerely thank Mr. Ashton for allowing me to interview him and wish him a very happy 97th Birthday in December.


Joanne began her fulltime education at Marhamchurch Primary School.
