

A WARTIME CHILDHOOD BY Marie Fields

As a six year old I felt safe and sublime. In the long hot summer of 1939. That year we took our holiday by the sea. Gathered fragile shells and strong smelling sea weed.

And splashed and laughed in the oncoming waves, When tired of digging with our spades.

Then the puffing train back to our London home,
To hear the warning wail of the siren's moan.
And strange loud noises in the street,
With the ominous sound of running feet.
Men appeared wearing gasmasks, swinging rattles and cried,

"Take cover, take cover, get inside! And Mother stern faced said "This is War", Ushered us quickly inside and closed the door.

1940 brought fierce fires, the night skies aglow.

The city ablaze under the relentless foe.

For the Luftwaffe Bombers came night after night,

To wreak horrific devastation before daylight.

Hearts pounding, trembling, cramped and afraid.

Under the stairs we crouched to withstand raid upon raid.

And so to safe leafy Bucks we came,

To be taught by a headmaster with a swishy cane,

Who controlled with a strict and iron rule.

The naughty boys in the village school.

But carefree we roamed in the peaceful beech woods.
Climbed trees, built fires to enjoy burnt half cooked food.
Collected scrap metal, for War Effort, to do our bit,
To help build spitfires to shoot down Messerschmitt's.
As youngsters we did not fully realise.
The terrible sacrifice wrought in the skies.
Of the brave pilots who diced with death each day.
To keep the merciless enemy at bay.

And those young airmen, some little more than boys,
Gave their lives, so that we could enjoy.
Freedom, secure in our homes and to walk to the lanes,
Without fear of the dreaded Luftwaffe planes.
Our valiant Armed Forces so many of whom died,
Gave their all, in order others might survive.
And England once more feel safe and sublime,
As in that long summer of '39.

Spotlight on Pat Johnston.

Pat was born in 1948 in Liskeard.
Her big brother, Tom, aged 4 at the time couldn't quite make out what all the noise was about and she says 65 years later he's given up trying to work it out!! Pat's father owned and worked the local sawmill in Liskeard.
Her mum, now aged 99, left school at 14 and went 'into service'. Life in London in 1940 was becoming pretty



precarious and so she returned home to Liskeard and later married her childhood sweetheart. In 1948 the NHS came into existence and this was something that was going to ultimately shape Pat's life for over 40 years. Pat left school in 1966 and began her training as a nurse at St.

Bartholomew's Hospital in London or Barts as it is still very affectionately called. In 1970 she became a State Registered Nurse and worked as a Staff nurse for the next year. Although Pat did not want to become a midwife she thought it would be good to learn the basics and so returned to her home to train in midwifery. "Midder" as it was called then was undertaken in 2 parts – 6 months in the unit at Treliske, Truro and 6 months "on the district" when just like "Call the Midwife" many more women opted for a home birth.

Pat had always wanted to train as a Registered Sick Children's Nurse and 2 years after becoming a SRN she was offered a much prized place at the hospital for sick children at Great Ormond Street. It seemed the only drawback was to do night duty. Her midwife tutor, whom Pat talks about very affectionately, advised her to take it. For the next year Pat said she spent some sad times but mainly joyous time helping so many tiny babies at their most vulnerable stage of their young lives. She qualified as a Special Care nurse in 1973 but was then offered a job as a Junior Sister at St. Bartholomew's which she took up working alongside she said 2 of the most eminent medical oncologists of their time, looking after patients with

Leukaemia and Hodgin's Lymphoma.

In January 1974 Pat became a Nursing Sister with the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service Naval College beginning at RNH Stonehouse. The first two weeks were spent at Britannia Royal to give an insight into how the Navy train its real officers. Three years later Pat was commissioned as an officer and became Lt Pat Hooper and not just Senior Nursing Sister Hooper. Pat couldn't swim and this proved quite a challenge when sailing dinghies on the River Dart. Why would someone who couldn't swim and easily got sea sick join the Navy? Must have been all those men in uniform! Pat even did a stint of Fire Fighting at HMS Raleigh, scrabbling around on hands and knees in a Tear Gas Filled Chamber. Not an ideal situation especially when your instructor will use any means necessary to stop his officers from rubbing their eyes, on exiting.

For Pat the best day by far was spent with the Royal Marines at Lympstone tackling part of the Commando Course. At least she didn't have to carry full packs plus a rifle when she climbed up the tower to the "Death Slide" and the bonus was for a Royal Marine strategically placed to catch her at the bottom. Pat said that the girls were accidents waiting to happen. In fact not long after her visit an unfortunate sister overshot the 'drop zone' and fractured her ankle. Even the awaiting Royal Marine couldn't catch her! Hardly surprising this was the last time the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service personnel were allowed to partake in the "Death Slide". One thing Pat refused to do at Lympstone was to test out the water tunnel and getting winched up into an helicopter turned her an interesting shade of green!

It was whilst Pat was in Malta working on the Chidren's Ward at Mtarfa Hospital and as a District Nurse that she met Alec. Alec was a Naval Officer with the Sultan of Oman. Later Pat returned to Stonehouse and was summoned to Matron's Office to be told that she was to represent the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service at the following Remembrance Service at The Royal Albert Hall. Although this was a wonderful honour for Pat she was also petrified.

A week into training for this big day was spent on Whale Island where she and others marched round and round and up and down stairs so as "not to disgrace the Navy". Pat said this training bore no resemblance to the Royal Albert Hall. On the Friday before Remembrance Sunday Pat travelled by coach from Portsmouth to London but rehearsals for the QARNNS sisters was not good which led to the frustrated instructor contacting the Matron in Chief, insisting that the 2 junior sisters lead off the parade. Pat said this soon knocked the smile off of her face and her partner, also called Pat because this meant they would lead off the QARNNS. The memory of the instructor banging his stick at the top of those stairs and the strains of Heart of Oak still remains with Pat today. Encouraged by those much loved Chelsea Pensioners we see at each Remembrance Service the two Pats'

marched across the floor in step and in time! Pat said she was very proud to have been given the opportunity to take part in one of our wonderful "institutions".

Alec and Pat were married on 1st June 1978 in Plymouth and shortly after Pat left the Navy to start married life in Sussex.

Four years later Pat remembers how she watched in horror as the Falklands War

erupted. She recalled that many of her ex



colleagues found themselves saving lives in field hospitals and on board the hospital ship, something Pat had been well trained for but thankfully never personally needed to put into practise.

Pat and Alec came to Southfields in 2007 and have two daughters, Emma and Emily and one step daughter Barbara. They have one grandchild, Megan aged 4. They both enjoy travelling and Pat says her favourite country being Australia which she has visited on 4 occasions. Pat and Alec support all events held in our village when they are able and are now the leaders of the Village Coffee Club. Pat loves walking and is also a foundation governor at the local school. I thank Pat for her time and wish her and Alec well.



MICHAEL'S LATEST MECCANO MODELS



The Roundabout: The ROUNDABOUT was for the younger child and was widely seen at most fairgrounds. In the 1960's and 1970's it had rotating chairs and leaping horses.

The model was 38 inches (96.5 cms) long and 26 inches (66 cms) wide. It took 354 parts and 760 nuts and bolts.

The Carousel: The **CAROUSEL** was also a fair ride of the 1960's and l970's and was quite a thrilling ride in its day. As the chairs rotated they just missed each other by inches and as the ride speeded up you got quite dizzy.

The model had a diameter of 60 inches (165 cms) and was 29 inches (73.5 cms) in height. It took 1810 parts and 3740 nuts and bolts.

The Big Wheel: The **BIG WHEEL** or sometimes called the Ferris Wheel was a real favourite for the people who liked a slower more relaxed ride.

The model I have built here had cars that rotated 360° per cycle of the wheel and stood 61 inches high (155 cms) and the wheel was 57 inches

(145 cms) across. It took 1092 parts and 2610 nuts and bolts.

Good information to try.


