FREE, FREE, FREE! How many times has that drawn your attention? This time it was from a hard talking sales person (just because ours was a woman, doesn't mean yours will be) trying like billy-oh to sell smoke alarms that will be directly connected to


the fire station. She was offering five of these complete systems, if you won the draw. What a surprise! Both Bude and Holsworthy Fire Stations are crewed by retained men (or firepersons). She also tried the same trick with burglar alarms also connected to the police station. (which of our police stations has the nearest response team?)

Don't buy these things from a cold call! Smoke alarms may be fitted free if you qualify, for either the elderly or the Vulnerable - Telephone 0800 7311 822 to check.

It was no wonder she didn't introduce herself or the company she represented. No telephone number was available. If you want a burglar alarm fitted, safely and securely, either ask a neighbour who has one or contact the consumer helpline (used to be called trading standards) on 0845 4040506. On the internet try "Trading Standards Devon" and surf the "Buy with confidence" list of 'approved traders'.

Please also be aware of cold callers knocking your door who become abusive if you do not buy. They are about. Call 999 having first shut the door in their face.

MICHAEL'S LATEST CONSTRUCTION Scammel Heavy Artillery Tractor Tank Transporter

These vehicles were used extensively by the British Army during World War 2 for the transport of tanks weighing up to 30 tons. It comprised of a 6 wheeled motive unit and an inclined 8 wheeled semi trailer with loading ramps.

The motive unit had a rocking front axle with a single transverse spring. Its rear wheel journals were carried on a pair of massive centrally pivoted equalizing beams along which the drive was conveyed by sets of spur gearing from a single central differential.

The semi-trailer was connected by a universal joint vehicle and had fully equalized road wheels. The complete vehicle was able to negotiate rough terrain. A powerful vehicle shaft winch was provided on the motive unit.

The model is 6 foot in length and 10 inches wide. The main gear box provides 3 forward ratios and 1 reverse. It took 1431 parts, 2685 nuts and bolts and 35 hours to build the tractor and the transporter. The crusader tank was not built to scale Michael just made it up to fit the transporter.

Our Journey! (as told by Amanda)

Daddy, Mummy, Sam and Jaydon Linney. Memorable day in 2012.



Darren and I met in a nightclub

in our home town of Watford in April 1995 and married in August 1998. For the next couple of years we enjoyed life by going out with friends, holidays, meals out and spending lots of time with family. I always knew that I wanted children with Daz happy to go through life without them but after some discussion we decided that we would like to try for a family and so two years after getting married our journey begins.

A year down the line we found ourselves paying a visit to the medical centre to see if we needed help but after undergoing tests nothing untoward was found. The only treatment involved me taking tablets but alas to no avail. We were then put forward for Intrauterine Insemination (IUI) treatment. For this we had to pay £800 a treatment and after three treatments again no luck. It was about this time that we thought about moving to try and give ourselves, and if we were lucky to have children, a better life. We found Hollybank and never looked back!

After 12 years of not being able to conceive we realised that if we were ever going to have a chance of a family then we needed to think of other ways. We applied to Families for Children, an adoption agency, to see if we would be eligible to adopt and very fortunately for us, Donna, who later became our social worker agreed that we would. The rocky road of adoption began! The process itself was not as bad as we first thought. It was however quite an emotional journey and we really had to look right into ourselves and bare our souls! Donna had to be sure that we were doing this for all the right reasons and that we would be able to love, cherish and emotionally support any children that came to us. We both agreed that we wanted a sibling group, preferably boys. This was because I wanted them to have a blood tie to someone, a history, someone that they knew when they woke up that first morning in our strange, alien house. We also knew that we wouldn't want to go through the process again. We then looked at quite a few profiles of different children in magazines. All of them needing a 'Forever Family' - but we couldn't take them all!

Donna was very good at this stage (she was actually fab through it all) because she kept us grounded. We had a 'list' of things that we knew we wanted from the children such as siblings, young as possible, had as little trauma as possible, loved the outdoors, loved animals, outgoing and gorgeous!! Donna helped us narrow our search and finally along came Sam and Jaydon!

We spotted their profile just before Christmas 2011 with Donna looking in more detail to check that we would all be suitable for each other and fortunately we were. Sam and Jaydon's social worker was then informed of our interest. Apparently there was another couple who had expressed an interest too and so an anxious few weeks for us followed, waiting for them to decide which of us would be chosen. At last in...we had the call we were waiting for and the agencies involved were to come and meet us to confirm what Donna saw, that we were all compatible for each other. We had still only seen photos of the boys and would only get to meet them when all was signed and sealed.

That night Darren, Steve and I went down to the Bridge Inn to have a bite to eat and to celebrate but unfortunately Darren had a TIA – a mini stroke. My first thought was....what about the boys!! My second thought was....my god, I can't live with him looking like that. Darren had treatment for this and was put on medication to prevent another one happening. Luckily, when we spoke to Donna she reassured us that she would talk to Sam and Jaydon's social workers. God was on our side and it was agreed to wait three months for the medication to do its job on Daz, before coming down to see us. They didn't ever suggest that we were out of the running.

The day finally came when Sam and Jaydon's social worker, their foster mum and dad, Hayley and Francis, and Donna came to meet us. It was very nerve wracking but they were all lovely and put Daz and me at ease and it was agreed that we were the right people to become Sam and Jaydon's 'Forever Mum and Dad'. Yay! But their decision was not final; it had to go to a higher level - still more waiting!

A plan was then put in place where we would go and meet Sam and Jaydon, who up to now knew nothing about us. This introduction would be slow and they would only be told when the decision from up high had been given. We were due to leave on 21st June 2012 to go and meet them but still hadn't had the final decision. Donna assured us that it would be given and we were to set off. It took us 5 hours to get to our hotel...still no decision but finally at 4.00pm we got the signal that we needed and the introductions began – how nervous we were!

The first time we met the boys was at their foster home. There were pictures of Darren and me on all the doors in the house!

We met Jaydon first...Sam was on the loo! He just stared at us, mouth open and then Sam came down and again stood with mouth open. Hayley asked, "who's this?" "MUMMY and DADDY" they both shouted! It was lovely to hear.

We had a lovely week with them seeing them both a bit more each day until we were able to get them up in the morning and bath and put them to bed in the evening. After seven days it was time to come home. Hayley and Francis brought the boys and their own family down to us staying at Hedley wood for the weekend so that ties between Sam, Jaydon and them could be severed slowly. It was a really emotional goodbye for all of us on the Monday when they left!

Then there were four! We've all had a massive roller coaster ride of emotions this last 18 months and I won't pretend it's been easy for any of us because it hasn't. We started off as two sets of strangers, Darren and me and Sam and Jaydon. The boys knew so much about each other and yet we knew nothing. We knew what things each other liked and places that we liked to go to but nothing about how we ticked, or how we were feeling. Thankfully with time we've grown as a loving family and love Sam and Jaydon as if they were our own. The boys too now see us as their mum and dad and constantly tell us they love us too. Don't get me wrong, we still have battles! But as my friends continue to tell me, that is what being a family is all about. We have the two most gorgeous boys. They're confident, loud, know their own minds and full of fun. I just wish we had as much energy as they have to keep up with them. They have brought so much more to our lives than we could have imagined with fun, laughter, tears, worry, love and so much

more. We would walk over hot coals for them, and we think of them as our family through and through. September 11th 2013 was the day we went to court and the day they became ours for good. Now and forever....Team Linney!!! X x

I thank Darren and Amanda most sincerely for sharing their journey with us. Many of us will remember that stork for ever – even when it is finally taken away! Editor.



Article for Bridgerule Buzz... Happy 2nd Birthday Devon Oil Collective!

The Devon Oil Collective is a not-for profit organisation run by the Community Council of Devon with the aim of enabling people in the communities of Devon to Bulk order oil together and save.

The project started up in February 2012 and is

celebrating a highly successful first two years with over 400 people joining the scheme, ordering a collective 850 000 litres of oil and saving £37,000 compared to the average market prices for oil. It was featured on BBC Television News programme 'Spotlight' broadcast across the South West on 30^{th} January 2014 which caps off a brilliant first 2 years for the county wide community oil buying collective.

BBC Consumer Affairs Expert Peter Shears gave his opinion: "I think it's brilliant, people getting together, people saving money".

The scheme is supported by a team of over 20 local volunteer coordinators spread across Devon who help to gather in the monthly order for their village or Parish area. These orders are sent back to the central office and one bulk order is submitted for negotiations. Month on month the scheme is managing to get prices lower that than the market averages for people in Devon. There is currently no coordinator for Bridgerule and Nemo Shaw, project officer for the Devon Oil Collective, said – "we are constantly looking for more coordinators and would be delighted to welcome someone from Bridgerule on to the scheme". Volunteer Coordinators receive free membership on the scheme.

It is open to anyone in Devon and there is an annual membership fee of $\pounds 24$ for individuals (businesses and community organisations have higher rates) and these help to cover the costs of running the scheme. They are so sure that you will make this saving up over the course of the year that they pledge to refund the difference if you don't.




BRIDGERULE POST OFFICE SERVICES

3. **If money is tight, contact your local CAB**. They can check to see if you are getting the benefits you are entitled to, or if you can get help paying your bills.

4. **Make sure** with your supplier and use an accredited switching website to see who's offering the best deal. Tariffs are changing in 2014 so it is important that you are aware of your current deal and any changes your supplier is planning.

5. **Most energy suppliers offer fixed price tariffs**, where the price of a unit of energy will stay the same for the length of the deal. These can work out cheaper in the long term and make it easier to budget – although you might need to pay by direct debit and your bills will still go up if you use more energy.

6. If you use a pre-payment meter, remember that standing charges will be added daily - even when you aren't using energy. Check how much they are and keep your meter topped up even during warm weather to avoid unexpected charges

7. **If you use heating oil as your main fuel**, buy before winter and see if there are any local oil buying clubs you can join. If not, you might want to start your own.

8. **Make your home energy efficient** – insulate lofts and walls, double glaze or use thick curtains to keep the heat in, and get your boiler serviced or replaced to ensure it is energy efficient. There are schemes to help with this.

- Save money and energy don't leave appliances on standby or leave laptops and mobile phones on charge unnecessarily. Fix leaking taps and always turn off the light when you leave a room.
- 10. **Do a home energy check** to find out about savings of up to £250 a year on household energy bills. Visit the Energy Saving Trust home energy check at hec.est.org.uk. Use this check to get a full report with details of your home's energy use and the savings you could make.
