Matt recently gained his Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award; which he worked for through Holsworthy Army Cadets.

To gain the award Matthew needed to undertake activities in four sections. These were service, skills, physical recreation and expedition over a training period of six months.

For the service section he had to help members of the community on a voluntary basis.

For his skills section he learnt Army Radio use through Army Cadets and had to take a practical and written test.

For the physical recreation section Matt took years 3-6 boys and girls from Holsworthy Primary School for after school football training. This he still continues to do today.

The last section, that of expedition, Matthew had to prepare for and carry out an adventurous journey as part of a team. He completed two expeditions

both with overnight camps. The first was in the Fremington area and the second was a 5 mile walk around the Torrington area. Before he was allowed to take part in these expeditions Matthew had to complete certain tasks such as first aid and emergency training, map reading and route planning to name but a few.

Well done Matthew in gaining the coveted Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award.

As we draw near to the end of another exciting term we reflect on what a busy term we have had. We are pleased and proud to say that since our last report we have had an Ofsted Inspection led by David Edwards accompanied by Charlotte Robson. Under the new inspection regime which only came into force in September, the inspectors judged the school to be 'good' with 'outstanding' features. The full report can be seen on our website.

Many children have participated in the various after-school clubs this term they include: Art, Advent Club, Craft & Netball. As always we are grateful for all the support we have received from parents and volunteers. Thank you!

This term we welcomed Mrs Catherine Frith who has been leading our KS2 children with Violin lessons. Our younger children together with their peers from Bradford Primary School enjoyed a trip to Rosemoor Gardens where they enjoyed a workshop enhancing their curriculum topic work on 'The Senses'. A music workshop was enjoyed by the younger members of school at Black Torrington Primary School.

Children have enjoyed participating in athletics and dance festivals organised by Holsworthy Community College. 'Children in Need' was celebrated by children and staff arriving at school wearing their pyjamas and 'whacky' hairstyles.



One of the highlights of the term was the Christmas Concert which this year was 'Where the wild things are'. The children had worked very hard in their Literacy lessons adapting the original 1963 text by Maurice Sendak to give it a festive feel. Despite a number of absentees the children gave a very good performance. Max a naughty child who sailed off to an island to be met by the

wild things was very ably played by Harry Dymond, Chloe Brawn played Max's mum, Coya Ingram and Tia Jenkin were good narrators. During art lessons the children had made some weird and wonderful enormous masks which the 'wild things' wore to great effect.




