### **Tracing Footsteps!**

About a year ago a Michelle Scott Tucker at her home in Australia typed into her laptop the word Bridgerule". The name that came up was Sheila and The Buzz! She then decided to send me an email saying that she was writing a biography regarding the life of Elizabeth Macarthur. Some readers may recall that an article was written about Elizabeth and Bridgerule in our newsletter a while ago. She went on to say that in 2014 she was hoping to



come to London for a business conference but wanted to include in her visit some time in the West Country to learn more about Elizabeth. So, ever the one to try and oblige I said "consider it sorted". In Spring 2014 I began to make plans for Michelle's visit. Where would she like to visit? Who would she like to see? What did she really want to learn about Elizabeth who was born in our village and who later became a pioneer in the farming of Merino sheep in Australia.

With the help of Diana, Rose, John, Vivienne and David and some others I tried to make it a visit for her to remember and so on 1st July my planning completed, this lady from Australia arrived on my doorstep. Michelle's visit to Bridgerule was spent in bright sunshine and passed very quickly but my wish was that it had been time well spent for her.

I'm sure it was, because a few days after she returned to her home near Melbourne she wrote in her blog "Elizabeth Veale, as she was then, was born in 1766 and raised in the English Village of Bridgerule, on the border

of Cornwall and Devon in England's Southwest. The time I spent in Elizabeth Macarthur's birthplace was absolutely the highlight of my trip to England. But as I always seem to find, the place mattered far less than the people.

The spritely, octogenarian, **Mr Bowden**, who showed me through St. Bridget's Church and then rang the bell for me.



**Rose Hitchings** who was almost as excited as me to find the gravestones of Elizabeth Macarthur's parents and sister. **Diana Green** who generously shared her knowledge, pictures and research. **The owners of The Glebe** now a beautiful accommodation venue but once the home of Elizabeth's best friend, Bridget Kingdon. They were more than happy for me and **my new friends** to explore the gorgeous grounds. **Rosie Beat** of The Bridge Mill, who showed me her wonderful, and very beautiful organic garden. **David and Vivienne Hale**, owners of Lodgeworthy (where Elizabeth Macarthur was born) who kindly invited me into their home, shared their information about Elizabeth and fed me the BEST afternoon tea ever!

**Diane** of Tackbear Manor who also showed me through her home and beautiful gardens. And last but definitely not least, Bridgerule locals, **Sheila and Colin Cholwill** who willingly invited me, a complete stranger, into their home. Luckily we quickly became friends and their generosity and kindness will stay with me for a very long time. It was entirely thanks to Sheila that my adventures in Bridgerule were so successful. *The woman is a human dynamo*!

A few days later in her blog Michelle also describes how she had just read the book "Footsteps" and what she learnt about following the Footsteps of Elizabeth Macarthur in Bridgerule. She says "I learned what a person born in North Devon sounds like!! (John and me I expect!)

I learned the name of Elizabeth's little sister, who died aged two years and nine months at Lodgeworthy. I saw that Lodgeworthy is physically central to the village and delightfully The Ham is used each year for the village carnival. I learned about the topography of Bridgerule. I learned about ghosts (at Lodgeworthy) and gardens and the open friendliness of Bridgerule villagers. I probably learned something about myself." In conclusion this story just shows that distance need not be a barrier. From a personal view I know that Michelle and I will remain in regular contact as I'm sure will Rose. She has offered Colin and I a holiday in Australia. Not sure if that will happen but I know a friendship has been struck. In return Michelle was truly grateful for the friendliness she received. Bridgerule I'm sure will remain with her for a long time. Sadly since Michelle returned home her mum has passed away. Your Editor.

## SAFETY INFORMATION FOR ALL TYPES OF DOMESTIC HEATING

With winter approaching some information to help and keep everyone safe:-

Chimneys should be swept at least once a year if using smokeless fuel or twice a year if using Bituminous/Household coal. When using woodburners, this should be done quarterly when in use.

Please check your house insurance as this could become invalid if you do not hold a current certificate.

Do not use flammable liquids to start your fire and always use a fire guard. Ensure that you have a working smoke alarm and test this weekly. You can get Carbon Monoxide poisoning from woodburners, open fires, Rayburns etc. from burning wood or coal! People think it is just from gas or oil, in fact, any combustible fuel can produce carbon monoxide so it is important to have an audio Carbon Monoxide alarm and have all appliances/chimneys serviced and maintained on a regular basis.






