




And if someone unknown comes knocking at your door, Don't just let them in. Get identification first. Don't phone the number they give you ! Call a neighbour or dial 999.



# 70 is the new 50!

Three birthdays close to each other were celebrated recently by a having an enjoyable meal out at The Falcon Bude.



Rose Hitchings, Freda Lacey and Christine Gee.

Victor Stewart Bickle was born in June 1946 in Stratton, a stone's throw from where he lives today some sixty nine years later. Vic's family was mum, dad, 5 brothers and 5 sisters. Sadly mum and dad, 4 brothers and 2 sisters have now passed away.

He attended Stratton Primary School and at the appropriate time transferred to Stratton Secondary Modern School. His parents were regular attenders of Stratton Chapel and Vic was always encouraged to attend Sunday school. Vic did

not always conform at Sunday school and was known to encourage others to do the same.

One day whilst watching his parents black and white television Vic saw Hank Marvin of the famous Shadows playing the guitar. Vic made it plain to his parents that this was what he wanted to do. Dad didn't think there was any money in playing music and told his son so. Undeterred, Vic began a paper round before going to school earning 7/6 a week and delivering groceries after school earning 12/6 a week. Dad was an insurance clerk and requested that Vic used some of his earned money on an insurance policy and after paying towards his lodgings he could save 50p each week which later would pay for his first guitar.

His parents were not amused with this purchase and the only place he was allowed to practice this much wanted instrument was in an outside toilet, with the use of a candle when it got dark! Each night at 9.00pm mum would shout for him to come in and go to bed. This self taught young man was showing a talent for the guitar and began playing in a Youth Group called 'Nite Life'.

Upon leaving school Vic took up employment at Bude Picture House (now Sainsburys) as a trainee projectionist.

One day someone heard Vic playing the guitar and asked him to attend an audition in Bodmin to become a semi-professional player in a group called 'The Grass'. He passed the audition and for the next three years Vic played up to 5 nights a week travelling to the best venues of the time in nearby towns such as Newquay and Falmouth. The group also played gigs at Plymouth for up and coming acts. One Vic recalls was Simon Dupree and his big sound .



One advert I read whilst interviewing Victsaid "The Grass", four good looking blokes that send the girls crazy and play all "POP"! But dad still insisted there was no future in music and so Vic began employment on a building site. Things did not work out and in 1963 he started working at Whitstone and Bridgerule Brickworks on the block plant. The manager being, the late Norman Stansbury.

It was whilst here that it was suggested that Bridgerule form a Football Club. Norman and the late John Dell got the team together. Vic joined and later became the captain. Vic remembers how he respected the playing of Ron Abbott and how he felt influenced by him.



It was at one these football matches that a young lady by the name of Janet



and her dad, the late Tom Honey of Dux came to watch. Not long after, Vic began making regular trips on his scooter to Dux and as they say the rest is history. In 1970 Vic and Janet were married at Bude Registry Office and bought their first home together at St Mary's Stratton; the home where they are still living. Vic was so busy working by day and playing in a

group by night that it seemed that if Jan wanted to see her husband she would have to travel to the gigs with him. In May 1975 Stephanie their eldest daughter was born. She now lives with her partner, Nigel and Vic and Janet's first grandchild, Holly, at Springfield Bridgerule. In July 1979 their youngest daughter Alison was born. She lives with her husband ,Dan a professional golfer and lives just across the road from Vic and Janet. Some Buzz readers will remember Janet's mum, Joyce, who at the age of 87 still lives in her own home in Bude. It was about this time that Vic felt something was still missing from his life and paid a visit to his much respected Sunday School Teacher of years gone by, Mr Tom Lashbrook . Vic wanted to become a committed Christian and so with the help of Mr. Lashbrook began training to become a Lay Preacher. In 1985 Vic was co-opted unto the Holsworthy Circuit Methodist Plan. The Brickworks now closed and Vic took up employment at TIC in Bude. Here he helped to make various aluminium castings. After a while of working there the staff found out that they were being exploited and so Vic decided to leave and began working at Dairy Crest in Davidstow. To train for this work he was sent to Cannington College in Somerset. Later Vic was asked to run the butter plant at Dairy Crest. In total he worked for 25 years at Dairy Crest and was in charge of the butter plant for eight years.

He then found employment much nearer to home and began working in the laboratory of an Ice-Cream factory at Kings Hill Bude selling to all the major supermarkets. After working there for 10 years sadly all the staff were made redundant due to the factory moving to Leeds. By now Vic was 60 and chose to retire and concentrate on teaching music.

On some days off whilst still employed Vic taught music at Bradworthy and St. Petroc's School's and teaching pupils various styles of music at his home. At one stage he taught as many as 7 pupils each evening between 5.30 and 10.30pm, Monday to Friday. 35– 40 pupils a week being taught either the guitar or the piano. Vic's music ability has been so successful that his students have taken and passed approximately a thousand exams either from the Associated Board Royal School of Music or The Rock School. Vic has spent many years volunteering with Youth Clubs and Young People including a group from Bridgerule at one time. Here he would encourage the students musical ability; be it the playing of an instrument or by their singing. Groups under the inspiration of Vic have seen their music taken into a recording studio many times and put on disc.

He was recognised one year for his voluntary youth and charity work, by receiving the much respected, The Eric Chadd Rotary Award.

When Vic relaxes he enjoys playing snooker with his sons-in-law. He and Janet enjoy walking and spending as much time as possible with their grand-daughter Holly. He still takes many services in our local chapels, is dedicated in various ways to his own chapel in Stratton and just over a year ago I asked him if he would lead a group of people who wanted to start singing at Bridgerule. Although still very busy Vic accepted and of course The Tamarside Singers were born.

I thank Vic for his Spotlight and personally for his commitment to our choir.

# CONGRATULATIONS EUCHRE PLAYERS!



# MECCANO FULLY AUTOMATED ROTAWHEELS FAIRGROUND RIDE by Michael Moore



The two wheels are 26 feet in diameter and are pivoted one at each end of a steel boom which has its main axle 42 feet from the ground. As the boom revolves so do the two wheels in the same direction and at the same speed. When the boom is dead upright the top of the uppermost wheel is 90 feet from the ground. The maximum speed is 20 miles per hour and of the sixteen cars carries two passengers.

The model stands 4 feet high on an 18.5" by 12.5" base. Journaled 26" above floor level at the apexes of 2 'A' frames is a double arm boom of 28" diameter

carrying at each extremity a 16" diameter wheel. The double arm boom is driven by a base mounted motor via reduction gearing and sprocket chain and by means of suitable gearing and shafting. The main wheels contra-rotate with respect to the double arm.

Parts used 1412 + 3318 nuts and bolts.
