Julia's efforts has raised the grand sum of £1000. She thanks everyone for their support.






VISIT TO BRIDGERULE C OF E (VC) PRIMARY SCHOOL


BRIDGERULE LADIES SKITTLE CLUB HOLD THEIR PRESENTATION EVENING

Spotlight on...... Mark Shears

Born a child of the sixties- "Peace and Love, groovy baby!!" Having said this the sleepy market town of Wimborne Minster in Dorset was not exactly the epitome of the "hippy" culture. Anyway, even I am too young to remember Woodstock! More recently though, Wimborne was reported as having the highest level of longevity in the



country. Maybe I need to move back there soon!

I had a very happy childhood and was brought up in a loving Christian home. One of the many fond memories I have is of falling asleep on the back parcel shelf of my father's Bedford TK lorry after an early start "helping" him deliver fruit and vegetables to local shops around Swanage, Lulworth Cove, Blandford Forum, Shaftesbury, Bournemouth, Poole and many other lovely areas of Dorset. I never thought that I would in turn follow him into the family business; but after two years studying a Business Management Diploma at what is now Bournemouth University, I was offered the position of "You start at the bottom, son, and work your way up!"

I learnt all of the delivery rounds, driving 7.5 tonnes gross lorries loaded up with what seemed to be more and more bags of potatoes to "fish and chip" shops in a fifty-mile radius around Wimborne. This was a lot more lucrative than it sounds! At this point we employed upwards of forty employees and gradually I was promoted to sales and ended up as a director of the company.

Mandy and I married in 1984 and we have been blessed with five wonderful children. Ben, a primary school teacher: Josh, a plumbing and heating engineer (they both live and work in Bristol): Abby, a theatre nurse in London: Joe, a musician who works at the Dominion Theatre in London and our youngest, Emily who is fourteen and is studying very hard at school.

Seventeen years passed with me working in the family business and as my father drew near to retirement I decided that this was the ideal opportunity to change my vocation and develop my career prospects. Well that's if you consider management with Sainsbury's Homebase as career development! However, I really did enjoy the comprehensive management training programme and also became a fully- fledged trained Horticulturalist. (Although you would never know this from the state of my own garden. I always like to delegate responsibility but this doesn't seem to work in my own household)!

Whilst working for Sainsbury's I found that I really enjoyed the teaching and training aspects of the job. I was already a qualified Fork-lift truck instructor (boys and their toys!) and found that I liked to see people develop and acquire new skills. With this in mind I was aiming to become a teacher and I completed my English based Open University Degree in 1998. This was a tough way to study, but a very rewarding process in the end.

In 1999 I handed in my notice to Homebase and secured a Secondary School PGCE place at Exeter University to study English and Drama. My first teaching post was at Sir James Smith's Community School in Camelford. As I walked into my first Year 11 lesson a student threw ink all over my new tie.

"It's alright sir, it's invisible ink!"

"Sure it is! Get on call for me right now!"

"Honestly sir, it will disappear!" Sure enough by the time a Senior teacher arrived the ink had completely gone! Welcome to the teaching profession! Things did get better. After two years at Camelford I secured a new position at Budehaven teaching English, Drama, Film Studies and later on Media Studies over a thirteen-year period at the school. I have very fond memories of the staff. Shakespeare productions where we played to packed houses of parents and children, and especially "Midsummer Night's Dream where I had to dress up as a woman! The comment was made that I looked like my sister with a wig on! Yikes! Happy days!

In 2014, a new challenge was on the horizon-teaching at an English speaking International school near Valencia, Spain. We had a wonderful time there, sun, sea, sand, sangria and small class sizes. I can highly recommend it!

However, as I write this the referendum result is just in and the country has voted to leave the EU. Watch this space! Maybe it won't be as easy in the future to work in Europe. Only time will tell!

After returning to the UK I continue to attend Bridgerule Methodist Chapel. I thank God for my new teaching position at Holsworthy Community College and for my delightful family. I now look forward to whatever pathway is in store for me.

Please stop me and say "Hi" if you see me out walking with my springer spaniel, Henry.

For those who do not know, Mark has lived in Bridgerule for ten years. Sheila thanks Mark for his interesting Spotlight which I know he didn't find easy. It's usually the students who are asked to write about themselves not the teacher. We at the chapel are indebted to Mark for his commitment and help in more ways than one.


