#### **GINGER CAKE BARS**

#### **RECIPE**

Ginger Cake Bars is a very popular tray bake at Coffee Club . After quite a lot of requests the editor gives Buzz Readers the recipe.

150 grms ginger biscuits
125grms unsalted butter
200 grms milk chocolate broken into pieces
1 tablespoon golden castor sugar
2 tablespoons golden syrup
50grms chopped crystallized ginger

# Topping 200 grms milk chocolate

Crush the biscuits/snaps into small pieces. (Put in poly bag and bash with a rolling pin)

Put the butter, chocolate, sugar and golden syrup in a large heavy based saucepan and set at a low heat. Let chocolate melt, stirring continuously. Take off heat, add the crushed biscuits/snaps and ginger and mix well until everything is covered in the chocolate mixture. Pour the mixture into the prepared tin and transfer to the fridge to set. Use a 11 x 7 inch swiss roll tin lined with foil.

To decorate, melt the milk chocolate and pour over the prepared ginger mixture. Return to fridge to set.

Then cut into bars with a hot knife.





### A LETTER FROM WESTERN POWER WHICH MAY AFFECT YOU

#### Dear Sir/Madam

Western Power Distribution will be working in the road at Bridgerule as shown on the map provided. This includes trenching and laying a new low voltage mains cable from the road by Bailey Gardens, past the Bridge Inn to the Bridge and also around 100meters down the road towards Newacott Cross. The cable will replace the main overhead lines in this area which will greatly improve the aesthetics of the road and provide a more reliable supply. We will also be changing/maintaining the poles as necessary.

The works are planned to start on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2017 and will take approximately 6 weeks, we would request if possible to keep the road free of parked cards so we have a clear access for excavation.

Western Power Distribution will do their best to keep the road as clear as possible but we cannot be held responsible for any damaged to vehicles that are left within the work area.


The work will also mean that the electricity supply may have to be interrupted and you will be informed of the date and times by a separate letter.



# 4 Years after it all began and the orders keep coming in for Grandad's Reindeers!

The Cholwill family never thought that the wooden reindeers would be so popular after 4 years. In the middle of October Paul put a few photos on social media and less than 24 hours later and after over 200 orders placed, he had to apologise to those who still wanted one of these 4 legged very individual, red nosed Christmas characters, but said for the time being orders would have to be suspended.

30 were later taken to a craft fair at The Falcon Hotel Bude and in less than 20 minutes Paul headed back home to get another 10. When he got back to the Falcon, a queue had formed and long before the craft day was due to close Paul and Bonnie were home having a cup of tea with over £700 raised for the family's favourite charity Little Harbour Children's Hospice in St Austell. One lady even asked Paul for his business card. Someone else mentioned what a good little earner it was. When told that all monies go to charity they were somewhat surprised!

Of course grandad hasn't made it easy for himself as he has now introduced baby reindeers and people are not only buying them for Christmas but some are becoming birthday presents. One this year was for a Golden Wedding Anniversary and they seem to be finding homes throughout the country. Paul and Stacey are about to set up a facebook page to see where these 'little dears' now live!

Early November Sheila was invited to a special tea party for Little Harbour volunteers. During that afternoon a video was shown of a young man receiving music therapy, a service the hospice provides. Nothing you may say unusual about that, but this young man needed help with everything and found it very hard to show any emotion at all. But on this particular day after about 25 minutes into the session he began to smile and join in singing with the therapist, something which had never been seen. This may seem like a small thing to the Buzz reader but it made Sheila feel how important the likes of grandad's reindeers were to Little Harbour which helps to support some of these extras. It was a magical moment.

As Christmas approached the local press printed an article about "Santa's Brightest Nosed Reindeers" and from there Steve Hardy of ITV Westcountry asked to come and film the process of making the reindeers plus a couple of interviews giving the family just 2 hours notice. The filming went well and a short story unfolded of how it all began and why Little Harbour was the chosen charity.

Local ladies have made the reindeers look very special this year by knitting or crocheting each one leaving the workshop a scarf. It's really been quite amusing to see families come and choose their reindeer; rather like choosing a puppy and taking several minutes before their final decision. If 2 children have to decide, then one will chose their favourite reindeer and one will select their favourite scarf and everyone has a name ready for their new member of their family!

This has fast become a family affair with grandchildren getting involved and now the help of Stacey's sister, Bonnie and her partner. The first year of production Grandad's reindeers were sold mostly to everyone in the village but now they are going all over the country. This year has seen them going to Liverpool, Scotland, Poole and Kent to name a few. Enquiries have even come from abroad and the television film has been watched by over 36000 people besides those that watched it when it went out.

The family cannot thank everyone enough for supporting them. This year has been the busiest year with approximately 350 reindeers made and


£6,800 has been raised for Little Harbour with over £13000 over the four years.

One of the projects that this year's money will go to is to redecorate and purchase furniture for the family lounge. Sheila volunteers each week at Little Harbour on Care side and feels very privileged to do so. She says it is a wonderful charity and the service that it provides just wasn't around when son Mark was living. It is a lifeline to over a hundred families from Cornwall and depends very much on such things as the making and selling of "Grandad's Reindeers".


