Your computer probably isn't broken or hexed, there's no need to turn it on for them. How does that work anyway? Do they suck up the information through the broadband connection? Or are they simply asking for bank details to "Fix- it" for you?

Don't fall for it.

Why would a supposed police officer ask to call round to see you on a matter of some delicacy and not know which station he's based at?

It's happened. It's a con.

Having had a phone call use 1471 to get the number used. Validate, or otherwise, the number on the internet. Some providers offer a blocking procedure to stop that number ever getting through again.

Offers, looking too good to be true, are also an enhancement for you to provide funds to get the prize, or whatever.

Don't do it.

These offers also come through the post. Don't pay to get it - as you will only lose.

You can't win if you didn't join.

Even if they stand on your doorstep with amazing offers - if you didn't want it before they knocked you don't need it now.

Send them off. Shut the door.

Let them all know you are about to report them to the police. See what happens.

#### SPOTLIGHT ON HILARY TAYLOR

I was born in 1948, the undiagnosed 2<sup>nd</sup> twin appearing 20 minutes after my brother Bob. Myself and Bob joined 3 older siblings and 14 months later were followed by our youngest sibling David. 1948 was an excellent year to join the world as it was the birth of the NHS! We moved as a family to Trewiland when I was still young and had a wonderful time exploring the Cornish countryside with our dogs by our sides and my sister Mary getting her first horse.



My mother was a night sister at Liskeard Hospital and my father taught Biology at Saltash. I was blessed with lovely parents who allowed me the freedom to roam as I pleased, but woe betide you if you were caught being naughty! We moved to Roseland when I was 11, which was every bit as lovely as Trewiland apart from the hill that had to be tackled every morning in order to make the 7.24 train to school in Plymouth 5 days a week. I took a vow during this time that when I grew up I would live somewhere flat. Thankfully I never kept to this!

In 1960 my father died very suddenly aged 47 and life for the family altered drastically. It was especially trying for my mother who had to work fulltime whilst raising 6 children. We continued to move on a regular basis for the next 5 years, beginning with a move to Carnon Downs, then Truro and after that back across the Tamar and into Devon. Although I was bereft at leaving Cornwall, I soon found the people in Devon to be friendly and settled well into the county.

When I was 17 I decided to leave school after just one year of my A Levels and started nurse training at Torbay instead. My mother made her final move during this time — to Lynton in North Devon — were she then remained until her death at 91. After completing my nurse training, I went on to train as Midwife, first in Bristol and then Winchester.

I followed Winchester with a year working in Jersey and from there embarked on a 2 year volunteer program with the VSO, running a maternity

unit in Malawi and teaching local midwifes. Upon my return, I met my future husband Peter at a mutual friend's wedding and we married 6 months later in October 1976.

As Peter was a Radio Officer on deep sea ships I joined him for 6 months on his ship after we were married. It was quite the adventure,



even after Malawi, and we were able to visit places such as India and Sri Lanka.



We eventually settled in a small village near Salisbury in a beautiful thatched cottage which we both loved until Peter left deep sea work and began a career on the ferries. This job change resulted in another move, this time to Kent. In 1983 our daughter Helen was born and 2 years later we had a son, Colin, who was very sadly stillborn. We had a lovely family life and felt very much part of the local community. I continued to work as a Community Midwife in the Folkestone area for the following 15 years until Peter passed away from cancer.

Helen and I then took a leap of faith and moved to Mere in Wiltshire, where she finished her schooling and I continued to work as a Midwife.

Peter was working as a radio officer on Townsend Ferries once he left deep sea. The Herald was the first of the new roll on, roll off ferries built in 1980. Pete joined her from the start and eventually grew used to her and all the new equipment. On the fateful night on March 6th 1987, he was on the FE6 a more traditional ferry and arrived home just as news of the disaster appeared on the news.

I was about to go on night duty in Canterbury and Pete was speechless with disbelief as I left. As the news worsen the whole area seemed to be holding their breath in horror. Many of Pete's colleagues and friends lost their lives or were badly injured and so many children seem to have lost parents and siblings. Many must have suffered for years afterwards. We heard many tales of real heroism and sad ones of people nearly making it only to slip into the black void. R.I.P.

Peter stayed at sea for another year after which we did a role swap so he looked after our daughter while I worked full time as a community midwife in Folkestone. Pete eventually turned his music hobby into a business

I have always enjoyed being active and took up running (including some 10km races!) and then Nordic Walking where I also took part in some races and walking challenges including the Isle of Wight 3 day walk. I also got involved with the local Chapel activities and 'went back to school' via the Open University to complete my degree followed by a Postgraduate Diploma from the London School of Tropical Medicine. Goes to show it's never too late!

18 months ago, having found that Mere was growing from a village into a town (I am a country girl) I decided to return to my roots in Devon and Cornwall and ended up here in Bridgerule after falling head of heels in love with Bude! I have thoroughly enjoyed getting involved with the local community — Table Tennis, Chapel and the Mutley Crew Dog Club - and meeting the friendly folk of Bridgerule and the surrounding



area, especially our local weekly walking group. I look forward to many more happy years here!

As editor I thank Hilary for agreeing to be Spotlighted for The Buzz. Since moving to the village she has become a very welcome member of our Methodist Chapel and is always willing to help at our village events. Most recently she spoke most interestingly of her midwifery days at our Village Coffee Club. Many Buzz readers see Hilary and her dog out walking together quite regularly.

Bear (pictured above left) officiated over the "marriage ceremony" of Miss Pinky Bear to Mr Mark Bear, at Bridgerule Methodist Chapel. Neal spoke with the pupils about the significance of the ceremony prior to presenting Mr and Mrs Bear with their "Marriage Certificate". #### Prestigious award for restored water mill

The Bridge Mill at Bridgerule near Holsworthy, Devon, has been awarded a plaque by the Mills section of the Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings (SPAB) in recognition of good practice in mill conservation and repair.

Sophie Martin of SPAB said: "Plaques are awarded to projects that accord with our philosophy of repair and demonstrate high standards of workmanship. The Bridge Mill is an exemplar of what can be achieved through dedication, inspiration and sensitivity; and presentation of this award raises awareness of what is possible."

The Bridge Mill was nominated by millwright and mill historian Martin Watts, who has "for many years watched the development of your mill into the success it is today under your careful stewardship".

The plaque will be presented when the Bridge Mill opens its doors on Sunday 14th May as part of National Mills Weekend. Owner Alan Beat said: "We've been taking part in this event since 1997, and I'm delighted that this prestigious award helps to make our 20th anniversary a special occasion."

Alan will be grinding organic wholemeal flour by water power from 11am to 4pm, with stewards on hand to explain the process. Outside the mill, there'll be morris dancing by the Lodestone Border Morris team, and the Bridge Mill's very own song written and performed by local musician Phil Williams; plus madrigals and folk songs by Bude Choral Society, Bradworthy Baroque,



and the Tamarside Singers of Bridgerule. Regular features include the mammoth plant sale and local craft stalls, while refreshments and light lunches are served all day.

Entrance is £3 per adult, 50p per child.
